Cultural Learning at our School

This term, students have been immersed in a wide range of cultural activities, guided by Miss B.

Our K–2 Cultural Group has enjoyed learning Aboriginal games, songs in Gamilaraay language, dance, and Dreaming stories. A highlight has been preparing to teach our Busy Bees a cultural dance, which they will proudly perform at their graduation next term.

Our 3–6 Cultural Group has been busy working on individual projects. Students have explored traditional tools, weapons, artefacts, and songs in their own mob's languages to perform. They have also experimented with traditional and contemporary art styles and histories to create their own artworks and stories, while learning more about Aboriginal cultures through fossils and artefacts. This project will continue into next term, with students becoming 'experts' who will share their knowledge with K–2. Miss B is also supporting this learning by connecting students with Aboriginal Elders and knowledge holders.


In addition, Miss B has visited every classroom this term to deliver a cultural lesson for all students. The focus was on the significance, history, and impact of cultural burning. Students compared bushfires with cultural burns, looking closely at the 2019/20 bushfires and the Scone Mountain fire, and discussed the strong relationships our local firefighters have built with Elders to help prevent future disasters.

A special highlight this term was our Cultural Day for the small schools in our area. Our Cultural Group students stepped up as leaders, running a variety of cultural activities with pride and confidence.

Students have also been monitoring their PLP goals with Miss B. Many were excited to celebrate goals they have achieved this term and are already setting new goals to work towards next term.

Alongside these activities, our Grounded in Country after-school program has been running Aboriginal Art lessons every Thursday. Students have loved the opportunity to explore culture and creativity in a hands-on way, guided by Miss B.













