


NEWSFLASH

Introducing our After-School Programs at APS

MONDAY

Feen's Friends is kicking off at Aberdeen Public School on **Monday, 11**th **August** (Week 4). Facilitated by Jamie Feeney, 'Feen's Friends' is a rugby league skill development program for children of all ability levels, aged 5-12 years. Participants can expect to have fun, make new friends, get active, and learn and improve essential game-play skills. Registration forms will be sent out via the parent portal on Monday and are due back to the school office by Friday, 15th August.

As a singer-songwriter, performer, artist and teacher, Baihe is sure to send participants home smiling and full of information.
