Positive Behaviour for Learning

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is Alex Park's whole-school behaviour support program which provides students, staff and families with clear expectations for behaviour and common, positive language for discussing behaviour. The three values of PBL at Alex Park are:







Sun Safety

Students are expected to wear a hat at all times during outside activities. APCS implements a NO HAT- PLAY IN THE SHADE policy. Students will be required to sit in the shade during lunch times and may miss out on sporting activities if they do not have a hat.

Homework

English	Oral language and communication Vocabulary Reading fluency	Students are engaging with the Department of Education's new curriculum this year. Students will cover the focus areas and content that reflects the essential knowledge, understanding and skills that students are expected to learn, including the study of a wide range of literature.
	Reading comprehension	
	Creating written texts Spelling Handwriting and digital transcription	Sound Waves Spelling is a systematic word study program for our whole school. Informed by research on the best practices for teaching spelling, the program incorporates four key areas of teaching: phonemic awareness, synthetic phonics, morphology and etymology. This includes: identifying focus phonemes in words, segmenting words into phonemes, reading and spelling words, working with spelling and vocabulary concepts.
	Understanding and responding to literature	
Mathematics	Number and Algebra Measurement and Space Statistics and Probability	Students are engaging with the Department of Education's new curriculum this year, working on their communication, understanding, fluency, reasoning and problem solving.
Geography	A Diverse and Connected World	Students investigate Australia's relationship with Asia and the diverse characteristics of places and environments. They analyse interactions between people, places, and environments, identifying factors that influence these interconnections. Students will formulate geographical questions for inquiry, utilising various strategies to locate, collect, and record relevant data to answer these questions.
Science and Technology	Physical World Digital Technologies	Students will focus on contact and non-contact forces and how energy is transformed from one form to another. Students investigate how electrical energy can transform to heat energy, light, sound or control movement in products and systems. Students will design, test and evaluate a product or system that demonstrates energy transformation.
Creative Arts	Music	Stage 3 students will be learning to play guitar. Students will learn about the parts of the guitar, how to play simple chords and riffs to accompany whole class singing. Stage 3 will also be composing a short piece of music using any of the sound sources in the Music room and utilising their musical knowledge they have gained throughout the year.
	Light & Shadow Puppetry	Students take on various characters and develop an appreciation for the elements of dramatic art. Students are able to explore themes, characterisation, vocal range, setting, plot, stage production and costume to express fictional ideas throughout their performances. This helps students to

		explore and develop creativity and new ideas whilst allowing them to develop confidence.
PDHPE	PE	Students develop interpersonal skills to support inclusion, within the concept of game development. They use their understanding of movement skills and modification to develop, create and play safe, fun and inclusive games including movement skill and performance, thus promoting healthy, safe and active lifestyles.
	PDH	Students will be looking at water, fire, road and sun safety for a healthy, safe and active lifestyles. Students will also participate in the Interrelate program which focuses on relationship education and adolescence.

Library

This term, Stage 3 students will examine themes of resistance and reform through "Aster's Good, Right Things" by Kate Gordon, focusing on speaking truth and finding voice during challenging times. The program uses Aboriginal pedagogical approaches called "8 Ways" to help students understand how individual courage contributes to community healing and positive change. Through weekly read-aloud sessions and collaborative activities, students will develop skills in critical analysis, personal reflection, and making connections between literature and real-world examples of truth-telling and social justice.

Attendance

Your child's attendance at school is important to us. Please ensure that students arrive **before 9:00am each day**. Supervision is available on the playground from 8:40am. All absences are to be explained via phone or email to the Bunin (office), or to your child's teacher. If your child is absent due to illness, please provide a medical certificate where possible. If your child is going to be absent for two weeks or more, it is necessary to apply for extended leave through the Bunin. Regular attendance at school is essential for students to achieve quality life outcomes. At Alexandria Park Community School we aim to work in partnership with families to promote regular attendance and support students in understanding the importance of attending school daily.

Did you know that if students miss as little as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed an entire year of education?

If you are experiencing difficulties with getting your kids to school, please let us know. You can speak to your child's classroom teacher, an executive member, or even the front office staff about how we may assist you. Our aim is to help you to help your child attend school every day.

Why is regular school attendance important?

Regular school attendance will help your child succeed later in life. Attending school every day makes learning easier for your child and helps children build and maintain friendships with other children. If your child doesn't learn the basic skills in the early years of school, they may struggle in later years.
