Over the holidays we will be getting new guttering around the school and our next bubblers installed. There will be workmen around all holidays and limited access to the admin building.





# Hey, you Mob, do you want a Deadly Future?

Wonnarua Nation Aboriginal Corporation and the Institute of Positive Psychology and Education at Australian Catholic University have a deadly research project and are looking for wanay (children) in Year 3 or 4 in 2025 to join our after school  $\underline{Ree}$  tutoring program in reading and maths Do you know any wanay\* (child/children) in Year 3 or 4 who want a Deadly Future? called Deadly Futures.

meet the criteria will participate. 60 wanay (children) will participate in the program in 2025. We will compare their progress in reading and maths with 30 wanay (children) who do not participate in the program in 2025 but whose families will have the opportunity to engage with our resources at the conclusion of the program. We aim to find out if *Deadly Futures* works to help wanay with maths and literacy. The first 90 children that

Over the course of a year, they will complete on three separate occasions reading and maths activities and surveys with a tutor online to track their reading and math progress and enjoyment.
