Welcome back to all students after the summer holiday break. It has been a busy start to 2025, especially for our new Year 7 students who have had some exciting and busy first weeks of high school. Year 7 Year Advisers, Mr Pratt and Ms James, delivered a new Introduction to High School Orientation Program to help them make new friends as well as settle into school routines and their learning.

Student learning and achievement, alongside wellbeing is at the core of our focus at school. I work closely with our Support Unit, as well as with students in regular classes with additional learning needs. Our staff have many exciting activities and opportunities planned across the school to support and engage all students with meaningful and real-world learning in 2025. Vaccinations are booked in for Year 7 and Year 10 in Term 2, which will come around quickly. Year 7 can receive their Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (Whooping Cough) and HPV vaccination on Monday 16th June. Year 10 can receive their Meningococcal ACWY vaccine on Thursday 1st May. These are free of charge and are provided during the school day. If your child is absent on vaccination day, there will be a catch-up day in November. If you would like your child to receive their free vaccination you can use the QR code below and register online. We will also email information out to Year 7 and Year 10 parents shortly. Paper consent forms will be made available in a year meeting next week or can be requested through the school office.

2025 has started well with many students coming to school with positive attitudes and wearing their school uniform with pride.

A reminder to all students that they have all received either an Assessment Mapping Grid (Yr 7-10) or if in Yr 11 a Preliminary Assessment Booklet or in Year 12 a HSC Assessment booklet. Students should be actively referring back these guides and ensuring that they are handing in assessment tasks by the due date. Late submission of assessment tasks may risk a reduction of marks and a N Warning Letter (Yr 10-12).

All students are reminded that they are required to bring their Yondr Pouch to school each day (regardless of if they bring a mobile phone to school or not). During the school day students need to ensure their mobile phone is locked in their pouch. If students damage or have lost their pouch, they can purchase a new one for \$15 from the office.

In Week 7, Year 7 and 9 students have NAPLAN to look forward to, which is an opportunity for schools and parents to understand important information about how education programs are working, areas for improvement, and which students need extra support in the teaching and learning of literacy and numeracy. Attendance during this time is important and we wish them well for their testing period.

The Ambartour is scheduled for Tuesday 11th March from 3.30 -5.30pm. We encourage students in Year 5-6 who are considering enrolling in Ambarvale High School in the near future, to visit us on the day to see what our school has to offer and to ask any questions they may have.

It has been excellent to see our school body return to school refreshed and ready to learn this term.

As the term slowly comes to an end and the weather becomes cooler, it is a timely reminder that students should continue to wear their full school uniform, including the correct school jumper and pants.



#### **Family Information**

"Have you changed your address, email address or telephone numbers?"

#### **Student Appointments During School Hours**

In the interest of good attendance and to minimise the loss of learning time, it is recommended that appointments for students be made outside school hours. Where this is not feasible, appointments should be made as early or as late as possible. We ask that you try to avoid making appointments during the middle of the day to ensure your child engages with as much teaching and learning time as possible.

Students who have an appointment during school hours and need to leave early should bring a note from their parents and give this to the Deputy Principal before school. This note should detail:

The student's name

Time of departure

Reason for the absence

When leaving early the student hands in the parent note and the authority from the Deputy Principal at the Administration Office. Following this process will assist administrative staff in ensuring that students can leave school at the required time to make their appointment.

Additionally, students who arrive late to school due to attending an appointment should bring a note from their parent indicating the reason for the late arrival. This note should be presented at the Administration Office when the student signs in and will assist us in ensuring that all absences are explained.

#### Welcome back to 2025!



Welcome back to school from the Science Faculty here at Ambarvale High School!



The CAPA Faculty are happy to announce that Art Club is back for 2025. See the attached poster for information or see Ms James or Miss Tobin for more information.





### ARCHIVALE IS BACK!
