

Students had a fantastic day and gained valuable inspiration for their own artworks.

















Make Break Create or MBC is back for 2025 with some very exciting projects running. Each term students from Year 8 complete a different rotation.


The rotations this year are:

Year 11 are about halfway through the Preliminary courses. Ms Arts and Mrs Maynard will be conducting senior reviews throughout the term for students who are failing to meet course requirements. They began working with our Heifers (Tulip and Blossom) towards the end of the term, in the hopes that we will be able to get up close with them in the not-too-distant future.

Science has started off with a bang this term!

Year 7 have begun their new topic on Earth and Space where they look at various sources of energy, the spheres of the earth and the water cycle.

Year 8 jumped straight in with an assessment task where they discovered the impact of friction. They used toy cars to determine the different amounts of friction from different surfaces. This is a part of their new topic Forces.

Year 9 kicked off the term by beginning their new topic Universe. In this topic they will learn about stars, star formations' lifecycles, galaxies and nebulae.

Year 10 has started working on their Motion and Energy topic. This topic will introduce them to Newton's Laws of Motion and sources of energy.

Last term, Year 11 Chemistry students attended the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation (ANSTO) Discovery Centre as part of their Depth Study. Students were able to explore why some atoms are radioactive and the operation of the research reactor. The students engaged in hands-on activities, where they were able to use devices to investigate the properties of radiation. The feedback from students was that a great day was had by all.

We will be continuing the GMSEN program with excursions throughout the year.





CAPA FACULTY


