A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We have hit the halfway mark for Term 3. It has certainly been a very busy term so far with more to come.

School Uniforms - It has been wonderful to see so many students taking pride in wearing their school uniform each day. Wearing the uniform helps create a strong sense of belonging and ensures that all students are seen as equal members of our school community.

Our uniform shop is open daily from **8:30am— 3:15pm** for any items you may need.

School uniform options include:

- Bottle green trackpants
- Bottle green jumper or jacket
- School polo shirt (with a white long sleeve shirt underneath if preferred)
- School dress (with a white long sleeve top and green stockings/tights in cooler months)
- Bottle green leggings or tights (please note: black leggings are not part of our uniform)
- Sports shorts (for sports days and events only)
- Bottle green skorts or shorts
- Sports shirts in house colours

As we move into spring, we encourage families to clearly label jumpers and jackets with their child's name. Mornings can still be chilly, and as the day warms up, students often remove layers in the playground and may forget to place them in their schoolbag. Labelling helps us return misplaced items quickly.

Unfortunately, we currently have a large amount of lost property that cannot be returned because it is unnamed. Lost property bins are located outside the front office and in the Kindergarten COLA.

Kindergarten Enrolments for 2026 - If you have a child, or know of a child, who will be starting Kindergarten next year, enrolment forms can be completed online. Simply visit the Ambarvale Public School webpage and click on the Enrolment tab.

Our Kindergarten Orientation sessions will begin next term, and we kindly ask that all enrolment forms are submitted beforehand. This ensures families receive all the important details and their child can be fully included in the transition program.

We look forward to welcoming our newest learners and their families to our school community!

Zone Athletics - The Zone Athletics Carnival will be held next week on Tuesday and Wednesday. Unlike our school carnival, Zone events are organised a little differently, and students do not always compete strictly within their age groups.

Events include:

- 100m: Top 2 placegetters in each age group
- 200m, 800m, Long Jump, High Jump, Shot Put, Discus: Top 2 placegetters in Juniors (8–10 years), 11 Years, and Seniors (12–13 years). Please note: all field events require qualifying distances to attend.
- 1500m: 1st place (and possibly 2nd place) in Junior, 11 Years, and Senior divisions, based on qualifying times
- 4 x 100m Relay: Junior Boys, Senior Boys, Junior Girls, and Senior Girls teams We wish all our Zone competitors the very best of luck and know they will represent Ambarvale Public School with pride!

Thank you again to everyone who came along. Your support makes a real difference in creating opportunities and improvements for our students.




PBL IS SUBSTITUTE IN SUBSTITUT



Under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CCDBS), funded by the Australian Federal Government, our services are at no cost to eligible students. We can provide dental services to eligible children who are covered under the Medicare scheme.

If your child is not covered under the scheme, our dental team can provide an oral examination, clean, scale and fluoride at a reduced price of \$99, the Medicare value of which is approximately \$185.
