

Student use of Mobile Phones in Schools Management Plan 2025

Rationale and Objectives

Ardlethan Central School supports the restrictions of mobile phones in accordance with the NSW Department of Education: Students' Use of Mobile Phones in Schools policy https://education.nsw.gov.au/policy-library/policies/pd-2023-0480. Mobile phone use in schools can impact student learning and wellbeing. Restricting mobile phone use at school aims to increase focus in classrooms, remove distractions and promote positive social interaction, while reducing the potential for online bullying. Ardlethan Central School has strong teaching and learning practices to support students in the classroom using various forms of appropriate technology, which maximises the benefits and minimises the risks of digital environments and prepares students for life beyond school. We foster a safe learning environment which supports and enhances each child's social and emotional health through our wellbeing and learning support teams.

Ardlethan Central School has elected to use the following approach. All mobile phones will be switched off and stored in lockers for the full school day, including recess and lunch. This is an approved NSW Department of Education option and will limit unnecessary distractions and complement our ongoing approach to ensure every student maximises their learning and social growth in a safe and supportive environment.

Exemptions

Ardlethan Central School understands there may be students who have a medical, wellbeing or learning need which will require them to access a mobile phone as defined in this plan. Please contact the school if this is the case and adjustments required can be discussed and planned for.

Contacting students

Ardlethan Central School understands there will always be emergencies when parents need to get in contact with students or vice versa during the school day. We try to keep this to a minimum, with the exception of emergencies, to avoid disturbing the students' learning. Parents and carers can make contact with the school through the school office on 6978 2046 and students will also be able to contact parents or carers through the school office if urgent.

Ardlethan Central School asks for all families to discuss this policy option with their children. Breach of the policy will result in the school contacting the family and alternate plans being enacted.

School Health—A Handy Reference Guide to Keep on the Fridge

At ACS we are committed to prioritising strong community health in partnership with families. We aim to minimise interruptions to learning caused by illness, while caring for the safety of our students, families and staff. In general, a child should not come to school if they are sick.

If your child is sick at home—Common ailments and what to do

Bronchitis

Cough is the main symptom of bronchitis, often dry at first, becoming moist after a couple of days. Other symptoms are a runny nose, sore throat and mild fever. Keep home from school until feeling better.

Conjunctivitis

The eye feels scratchy, is red and may water. Lids may stick together on waking. Keep home from school while there is discharge from the eye unless a doctor has diagnosed a non-infectious cause.

Diarrhoea

Two or more consecutive bowel motions that are looser and more frequent than normal and possibly stomach cramps. Keep home from school for 24 hours after diarrhoea has stopped.

Gastroenteritis

A combination of frequent loose or watery stools (diarrhoea), vomiting, fever, stomach cramps, headaches. Keep home from school until 24 hours after diarrhoea/vomiting stops.

Head lice or nits

Itchy scalp (sometimes), white specks stuck near the base of the hairs, lice may be found on the scalp. As long as head lice management is ongoing the child can attend school.

Impetigo (school sores)

Small red spots change into blisters that fill up with pus and become crusted, usually on the face, hands or scalp. Keep home from school until one day after antibiotic treatment starts. Sores and blisters should be covered with watertight dressings until all blisters have dried up.

Influenza

Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, muscle aches and headaches. Keep home from school until well.

Ringworm

Small scaly patch on the skin surrounded by a pink ring. Keep home from school for 24 hours after fungal treatment has begun.

Worms (threadworms, pinworms)

The main sign is an itchy bottom. Sometimes children feel 'out of sorts' and do not want to eat much. They may also have trouble sleeping, due to itching at night. They can come to school, but please treat and ensure careful hand washing.

In general

If your child displays any of the following symptoms they should stay at home and see a doctor: a fever of 38° or above; vomiting or diarrhoea; cough or respiratory symptoms; cold or flu symptoms; rashes of an unknown origin. If your child is too sick for school please let the school know by phone, email, SMS or written note as soon as possible.

If your child is sick at school

If your child gets sick or injured at school, the school will contact you. If your child is ill, they will go to sick bay where they can lie down and be monitored. You will be called to come and collect your child if they are too sick to go back to the classroom. For this reason it is important to keep your contact details up to date with the school, including an alternative contact—such as a relative or neighbour—who the school can call if you are unavailable.

The school will contact parents if an outbreak of any notifiable illness is known to have occurred amongst students.

REMINDER:

 If your child is absent from school there is a requirement for you to provide a reasonable explanation for the absence within seven days. It is the Principal's discretion as to whether they deem an explanation as reasonable.

If an explanation is not received the students' absence will automatically be recorded as unjustified.

- Absences include late arrivals and early departures to and from school which also require an explanation.
- Absence notification methods that are acceptable are: Verbal (telephone or in person), reply text to school Sentral, email or written note.
- If your child is absent because of illness for more than three consecutive days you will be required to provide a medical certificate with your absence notification.
- At times there may be a requirement for your children to be absent for extended periods of time. If this is the case you will need to
