The CORE Rules

All students in NSW government school are expected to:

- Attend every school day/unless legally excused, and be in class on time and prepared to learn
- Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform or dress code
- Behave safely, considerately and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school
- Show respect at all times for teachers, other school staff and helpers, following class rules, speaking courteously and co-operating with instructions and learning activities
- Treat one another with dignity and respect
- Care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others
- Behaviour that infringes on the safety of others, such as harassment, bullying and illegal or anti-social behaviour of any kind will not be tolerated

The School Wellbeing Policy and STRIVE code aims to:

- Create a safe, caring school environment wherein all students are supported as they learn
- Enhance effective teaching and learning by encouraging students to take responsibility for their own learning.
- Provide students with a range of opportunities to demonstrate success, respect and responsibility.
- Allow students to be partners with their teachers and parents in the learning process
- Allow students to be valued as learners.
- Allow students to develop skills in forming positive relationships, social responsibility, problem solving and dispute resolution.
- Provide students opportunities to develop confidence and self-esteem.
- Where appropriate, promote student participation in decision-making
- Develop and implement policies and procedures that protect the rights, safety and health of all school community members
- Providing opportunities for all students to develop the skills needed for positive relationships, civic responsibility, problem-solving and conflict resolution
- Value and celebrate gender and cultural differences
- Establish strong and supportive community and interagency networks

Staff Responsibilities

- Follow the STRIVE code for Arthur Phillip High School.
- Follow policies and procedures that protect the rights, safety and health of the whole school population.
- Identify and cater for individual learning needs of all students.
- Establish well managed and safe learning environments.
- Provide programs, resources and support services for students with specific needs.

- Utilise alternative learning programs established by Learning Support Team.
- Be familiar with all Student Health / Medical Plans.
- Be familiar with all Aboriginal Students' Personalised Learning Plans

Responsibilities of Parents and Carers

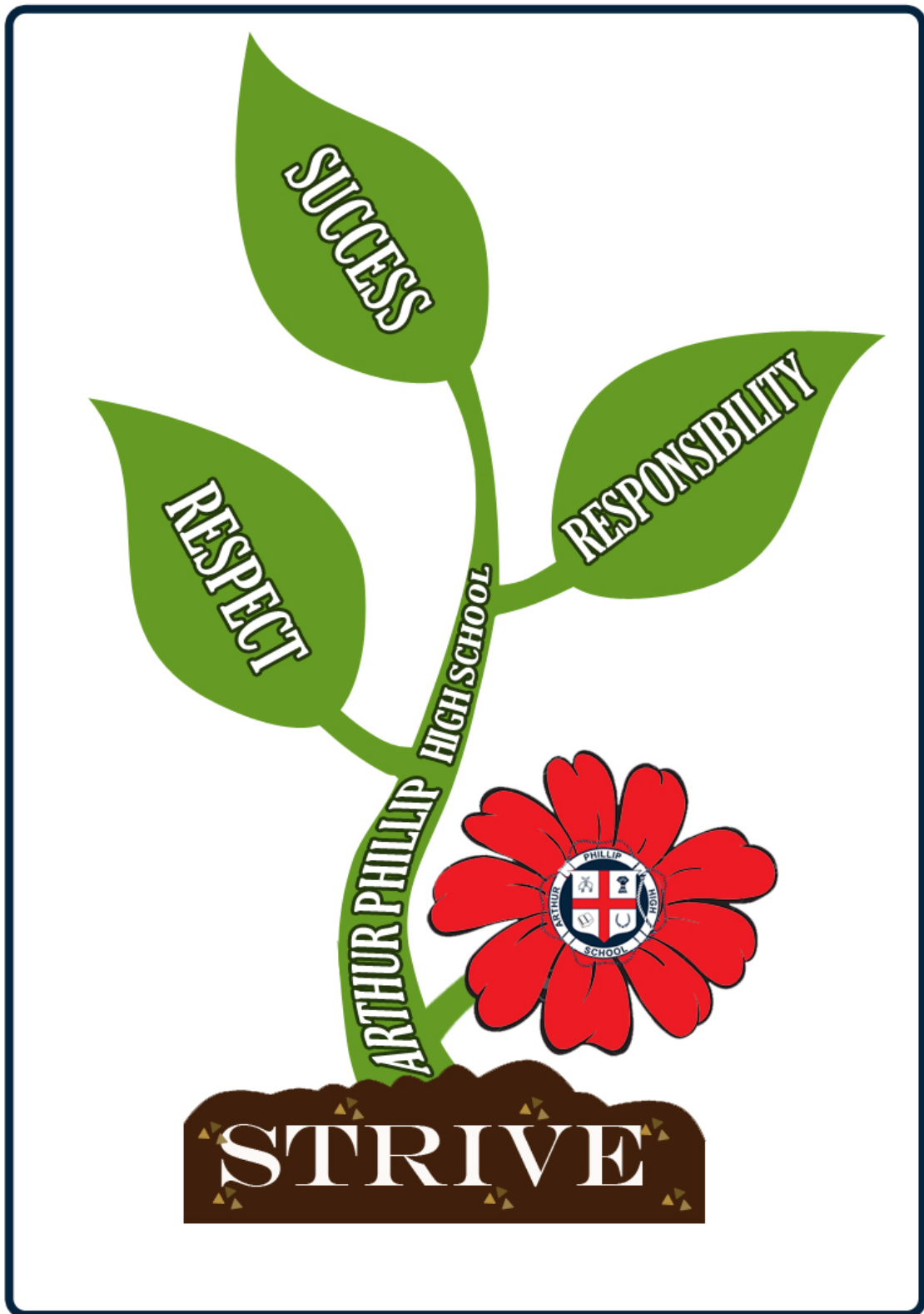
Parents will be encouraged to:

Above and Below the Line Behaviours

ABOVE THE LINE

- Verbal abuse to staff and other students
- Physical fighting and aggression, the school is committed to a "hands off" policy
- Vandalism of school and others property and disrespectful treatment of school and other's resources
- Cyber bullying and the inappropriate use of technology that causes harm to the school community
- Using harassing, racist, homophobic or offensive language to others
- Using threatening and or intimidating language or behaviour with the intent to harm
- Persistent disobedience
- Persistent disruption to the learning of others
- Criminal offences - stealing, weapons or drugs.

BELOW THE LINE

- Using technology inappropriately, which includes having and using your phone in class
- Late to class
- Out of uniform
- Failure to complete assigned work in class and tasks assigned for homework
- Out of your seat without permission
- Using deodorant or aerosol sprays in class
- Repeatedly asking to go to the toilet
- Eating in class
- Not prepared for class - including not bringing the correct resources required for a lesson, such as your PE uniform

RESPONSIBILITY – To recognise and understand my obligations as a member of the APHS community

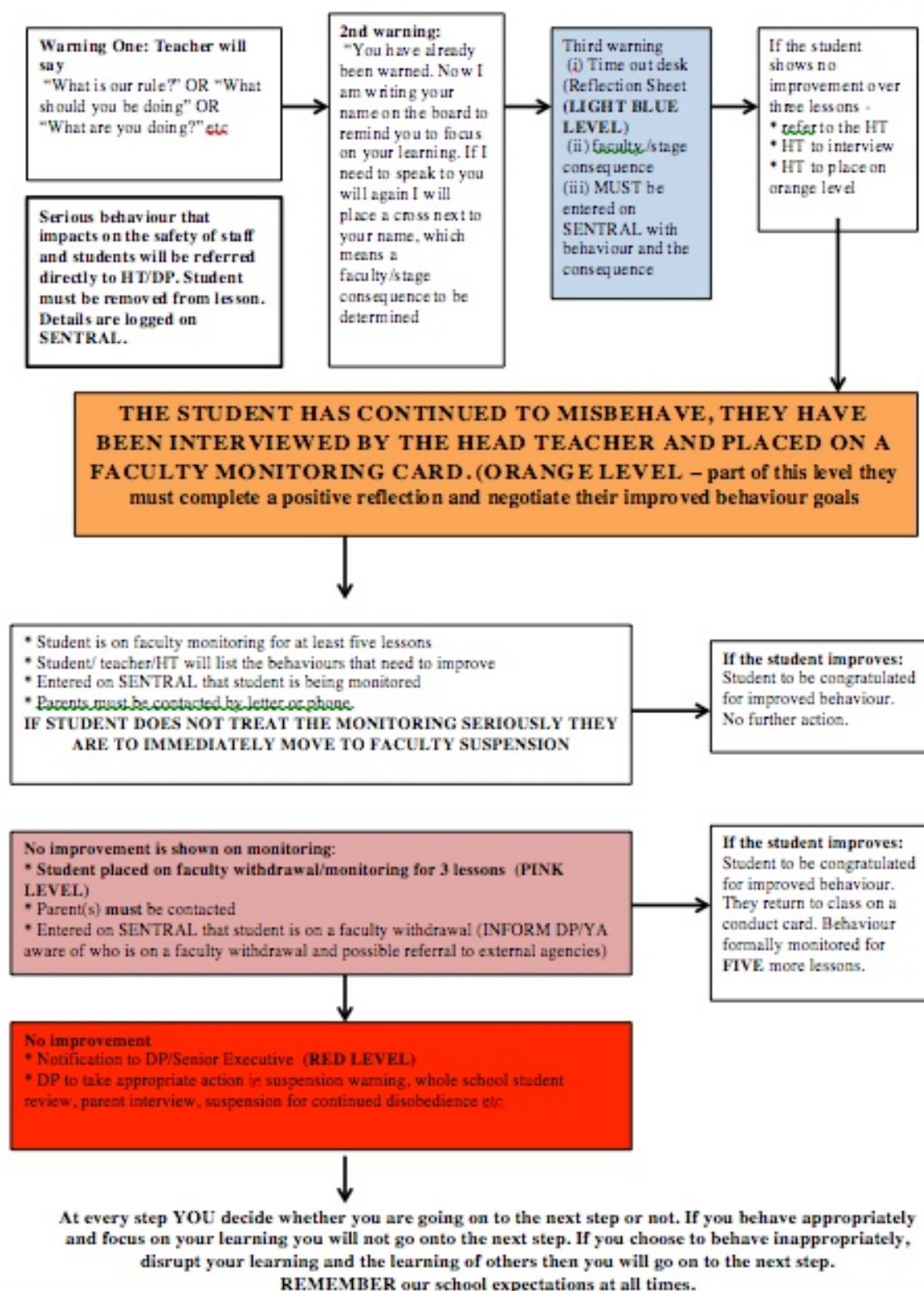

Anti Bullying Chart – part of the whole school commitment to stopping bullying as indicated in the school’s Anti Bullying Plan

| | STOP | HELP | TELL |
|--|---|---|--|
| Bystanders (People who witness bullying) | STOP reinforcing the person bullying – show your disapproval (e.g., walk away, shake your head in disapproval). Tell the person bullying to STOP only when it is safe to do so. | HELP the person being bullied by removing them from the situation | TELL someone you can trust (e.g., a friend, teacher, parent, counsellor, police) that can put a stop to the bullying |
| Targets (People being bullied) | STOP reacting to the bully (e.g., avoid being in places where the bully is likely to be, ignore the bully, walk away from the bully). | Seek HELP from the people you trust (e.g., a friend to walk home with you) | TELL someone you can trust that you need help to put a stop to the bullying |
| Bullies (People who bully) | STOP yourself from bullying others by controlling your own behaviour | Seek HELP to control your behaviour from people you trust (e.g., a friend that can help you control your temper) | TELL someone you can trust that you need help to stop bullying others |
