
MUSIC CONCERT

SCHOOL SURVEY

In Term 2, we are offering our students the opportunity to participate in the NSW Public Schools Student Survey.



The survey gives students the chance to share their thoughts and feelings about life at school, including questions about their **engagement**, **learning experiences** and **wellbeing** at school.

Hearing directly from our students will help us **understand what's working well** and where **improvements can be made** to our school. The survey is confidential, takes around 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and will be conducted online during school hours.
