Principal's Message

School Planning Feedback

Thank you to the parents that took a few minutes to provide us with valuable feedback. We are using the data to help create our next school plan to ensure we include student, staff and community input. Here is a summary of what you told us:

1. Student Transitions & Orientation

Parents expressed strong interest in smoother transitions, particularly for children entering Kindergarten and moving into high school. Suggestions included more opportunities for orientation days, stronger communication with parents about what to expect and additional support for students who may find transitions challenging. Families value programs that help students settle quickly, build confidence and feel a sense of belonging in their new environment.

2. Attendance & Engagement

Feedback highlighted the importance of maintaining high attendance and student engagement. Parents recognised the school's efforts in promoting regular attendance but identified a need for stronger follow-up and personalised approaches for students at risk. Some parents suggested that engaging learning experiences, recognition of achievements and positive reinforcement strategies would encourage consistent attendance and participation.

3. Student Wellbeing & Behaviour

Wellbeing was consistently mentioned as central to student learning. Parents valued the supportive relationships fostered between staff and students but felt there was room to strengthen wellbeing initiatives. Suggestions included clear, consistent behaviour management practices across the school, more proactive strategies to build resilience and emotional regulation and programs that nurture respectful relationships and inclusivity among peers.

4. Inclusion & Support for Diverse Learners

Families emphasised the importance of ensuring all students, including those with additional learning needs, feel supported and included. Parents would like to see ongoing professional learning for staff to better address the needs of diverse learners, with a focus on early identification, targeted intervention and effective adjustments in the classroom. Clear communication with parents about support strategies was also noted as an area to focus on.

5. Communication & Reporting

Communication between school and home was a key area of feedback. Parents appreciated regular updates but expressed a desire for more detailed information about student progress, particularly in the form of constructive feedback that identifies strengths and next steps. They also noted the need for consistency across classes in how information is shared, suggesting digital tools and streamlined processes could help ensure families feel well-informed.

6. Parent Involvement & Community Connection

Parents value the strong sense of community at Bangor Public School and would like further opportunities to be involved in school life. Suggestions included more classroom open days, workshops to help parents support learning at home and events that showcase student achievements. Parents expressed that stronger connections between school and families not only benefit students academically but also foster a more inclusive and supportive environment.

7. Facilities. Resources & Extracurricular Opportunities

Several parents identified the importance of maintaining and improving school facilities, particularly spaces that support active play, creative learning and technology use. Access to high-quality resources was seen as key to engaging students across a range of interests. Families also expressed strong appreciation for extracurricular activities and encouraged continued investment in opportunities such as sport, performing arts, and STEM-based clubs to extend student learning beyond the classroom.



This year we are having a local small business come to our school, as we did last year. **The Best Little Bookshop in Town** is located in Cronulla and is a fully Australian owned company with a vast selection of high-quality literature, including lots of Australian authors and small Australian publishers. Book Fairs promote literacy and foster the joy of reading in children.

The Fair will only be open during Grandfriends Day. It will be held in the school hall and open for visitors from 1.05pm until 2.45pm. This will be the only opportunity for purchasing from the Book Fair. Anyone who cannot attend during this time can purchase online. Students are not permitted to enter the hall without their Grandfriend.

The Best Little Bookshop in Town creates a webpage for us, including all the books they are planning to bring to the Fair. We will be given a discount code so parents and families can pre-purchase any titles prior to the Fair and it will be left for one week after the Fair for those who were unable to attend.

The Fair offers families a 10% discount off the RRP on all books. They also give the school 10% of the sales to our school.

As the Book Fair is occurring in the first week of Term 4, our website and discount code will go live on the morning of Friday 26th September, (Term 3 Week 10). It will remain open until midnight on Thursday 23rd October, (Term 4 Week 2).
