

THURSDAY COOK WITH US BLUEBERRY MUFFINS







Ingredients

- 3 large ripe bananas
- ¾ cup sugar
- 1 egg slightly beaten
- 1/3 cup melted butter
- 1 cup blueberries
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1½ cups flour

Method

- 1. mash bananas in a large mixing bowl
- 2. add sugar and egg
- 3. add butter and blueberries
- 4. combine dry ingredients and gently stir into banana mixture
- 5. pour into 12 well-greased muffin cups
- 6. bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes

After the story, the students participated in a craft activity where they created their own trucks. It was a wonderful way to extend the learning experience and encourage creativity!









E-scooters: Advice for families

An e-scooter is an electric scooter that is powered by a rechargeable battery.

Is my child allowed to ride an e-scooter?

In NSW, it is **illegal** to ride a privately owned e-scooter on roads or road-related areas, including footpaths, shared paths, cycle ways and cycle paths.

If you allow your child to ride a privately owned e-scooter, they are **only permitted** to ride it on private property.

Is my child allowed to ride in a e-scooter trial area?

E-scooter shared schemes are being trialled in designated local government areas in NSW.

Your child must be **16 years or older** to hire and ride a shared e-scooter within a trial area.

Hired shared scheme e-scooters are only able to be used on roads and road-related areas in the designated e-scooter trial areas. It is illegal for privately owned e-scooters to be ridden on NSW roads or road related areas, including in trial areas.







What is the law and safety advice in a trial area?

If you allow your 16 years or older child to hire and ride a shared e-scooter within a trial area, you should be aware that your child must:

- ▶ hire a shared e-scooter only from the selected provider in the trial area
- •use a shared e-scooter on selected roads, bike paths and shared paths, in the trial area
- stay under 10km/h on shared paths and 20km/h on the road
- ▶ always wear an approved helmet
- not carry passengers
- ▶ not use a mobile phone whilst riding

It is recommended that your child wears brightly coloured clothing so other road users can easily see them.

Your child must be 16 years or older to hire and ride a shared e-scooter within a trial area.
