

Assessment Information for Students Year 7 - 11

On Tuesday and Wednesday, all students received their 2025 Assessment Booklet, which outlines key assessment information, including school-based requirements, common grade scales, marking criteria, assessment procedures, and important rules. The booklet also provides a timeline of assessment tasks, detailing when they will be distributed and completed throughout the year.

During the session, students examined an example assessment task, focusing on the marking rubric and guidelines. They also received an explanation of their reports and GPA (Grade Point Average) calculation. To support their organisation and time management, each student was given a large yearly calendar to help plan for their first assessment task.

Regular attendance and punctuality are essential for success. If a student is absent on the day an assessment task is due, they must provide a medical certificate or have approved leave; otherwise, a mark of zero will be recorded. Students in Year 10 -12 are also required to complete an Illness and/or Misadventure application.

On Thursday night, the Barrenjoey P&C will be hosting the New Parent Welcome Evening held on the School Hall Deck. This special event is your chance to meet your child's teachers and the Executive Team. We look forward to welcoming parents and carers in an informal and friendly atmosphere.


PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH & PHYSICAL EDUCATION








Would you like to be involved at Barrenjoey but do not have a lot of time?
