CLASSROOM CAPERS

KINDERGARTEN

In kindergarten, number talks give children a fun and relaxed way to explore math together. During these short conversations, students share how they figured out an answer and listen to their classmates' ideas. This helps them learn that there's often more than one way to solve a problem! Number talks build confidence, encourage clear thinking, and help children feel comfortable talking about numbers. They also give teachers a great window into how each child is learning, so they can better support their growth in math.





1/2/3

Our Year 2/3 students have been busy sharpening their descriptive writing skills! Using The Twits by Roald Dahl for inspiration, students wrote detailed paragraphs describing the unforgettable Mrs Twit. They used the Bump It Up Wall to guide and improve their writing, focusing on strong adjectives, vivid verbs, and clear sentence structure.

To bring their descriptions to life, students created imaginative portraits of Mrs Twit and painted them using watercolours. The results were both colourful and wonderfully gruesome — just like the character herself!









4/5/6

To begin this term, 4/5/6 have been busy learning about Data and Chance in maths lessons. Learning about data and chance helps students understand the world through numbers and patterns. Children learn how to collect, organize, and interpret data using simple graphs, tables, and charts. They explore probability by predicting and testing outcomes — like rolling dice or drawing coloured counters — to understand ideas such as "likely," "unlikely," and "certain." These activities build critical thinking skills and helps students make sense of information.

- Beach volleyball or cricket








