BEST HSC FOR ME

- Preliminary and HSC students attend school 5 days a week at their respective campuses
- The return to a 5-day schooling week for senior students was implemented for a variety of reasons including:
 - improving learning continuity for students
 - increasing connectedness with school
 - increasing learning and study time
- The overarching theme of this change is to improve learning outcomes for students and better prepare our learners for post-school transitions.

COURSE SELECTION CONSIDERATIONS



In 2022, the Minister for Education announced a raft of HSC reforms as part of the Curriculum Reform program, which included removing classifications for ATAR courses. **Previously, only 2 units of a Category B courses could contribute to the ATAR.**

The announcement came after a review of the VET sector identified current HSC and ATAR arrangements as a barrier to developing a pipeline of job-ready high school graduates. The Joint ATAR Reform Advisory Committee also recommended the removal of HSC course categories for the calculation of the ATAR.

This piece of reform aims to lift the perceived value of vocational studies and will give students the opportunity to study more courses they are interested in and passionate about.

The change will be in place from the 2025 HSC.

MINIMUM STANDARDS

- To be eligible for a HSC students need to demonstrate they have met a minimum standard in literacy and numeracy.
- Students will have several opportunities to meet the HSC minimum standard. This includes six opportunities each year from Year 10 up to five years after starting their first HSC course.
- Students will show they meet the HSC minimum standard by passing online tests of basic literacy and numeracy skills.



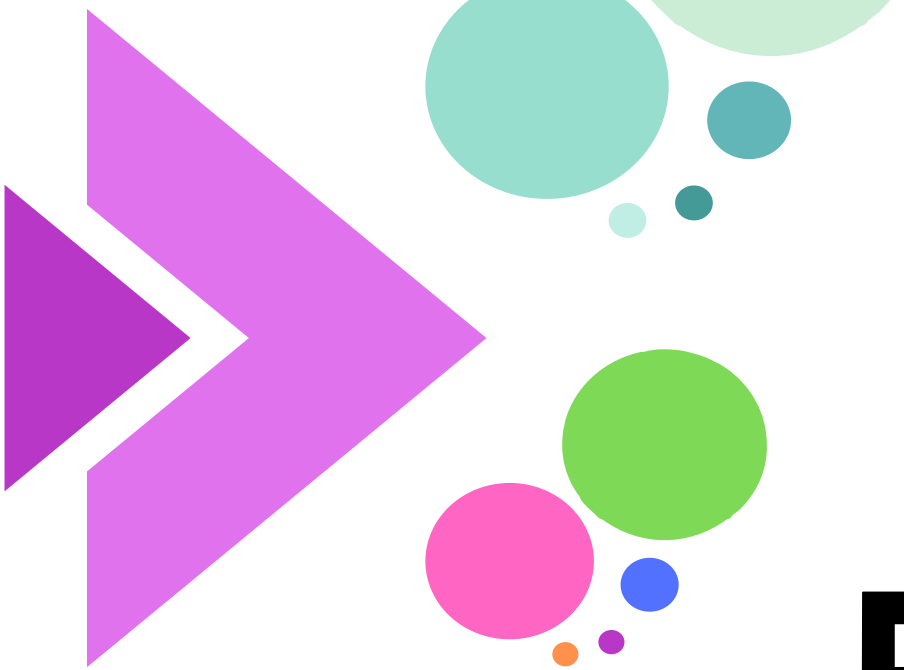
EXAM PROVISIONS

Exam provisions in the HSC are practical changes that help students make a fair attempt to show what they know in the exams. Exam Provisions are usually for students with a medical condition or disability, including:

- a permanent condition
- a temporary condition
- an intermittent condition

Schools are responsible for adjustments in school-based assessment tasks. NESAC determines disability provisions for HSC exams.

- More than 10,000 HSC students apply for provisions each year.

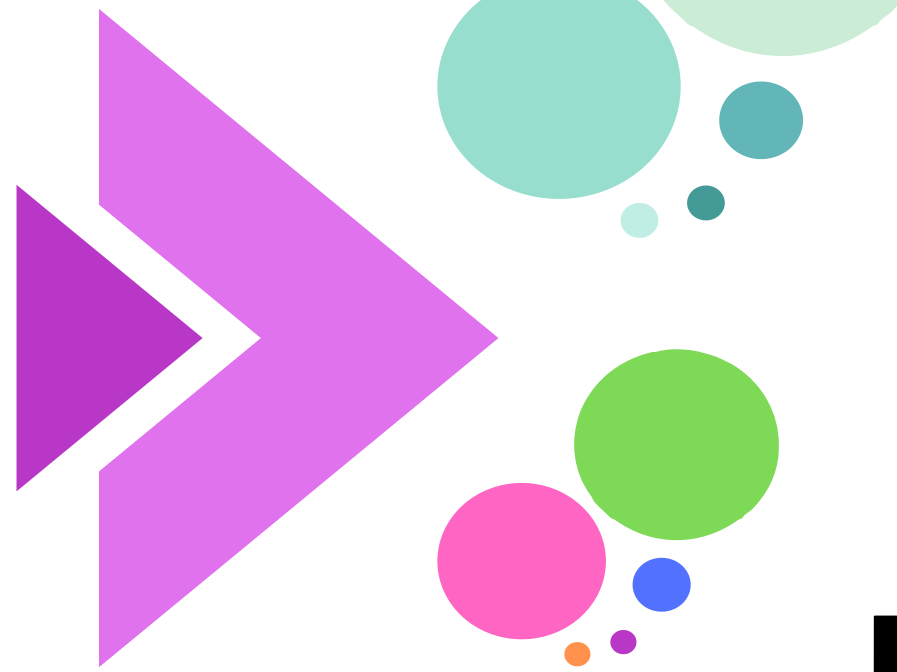
ROSA PATTERN OF STUDY

Students who do not complete their HSC may receive a RoSA. The RoSA is a cumulative record of achievement that includes a student's record of academic achievement up until the date they leave school.

The RoSA records (where applicable):

- completed Stage 5 (Year 10) courses and grades
- completed Preliminary Stage 6 (Year 11) courses and grades
- HSC (Year 12) results
- any uncompleted Preliminary Stage 6 courses or HSC courses.

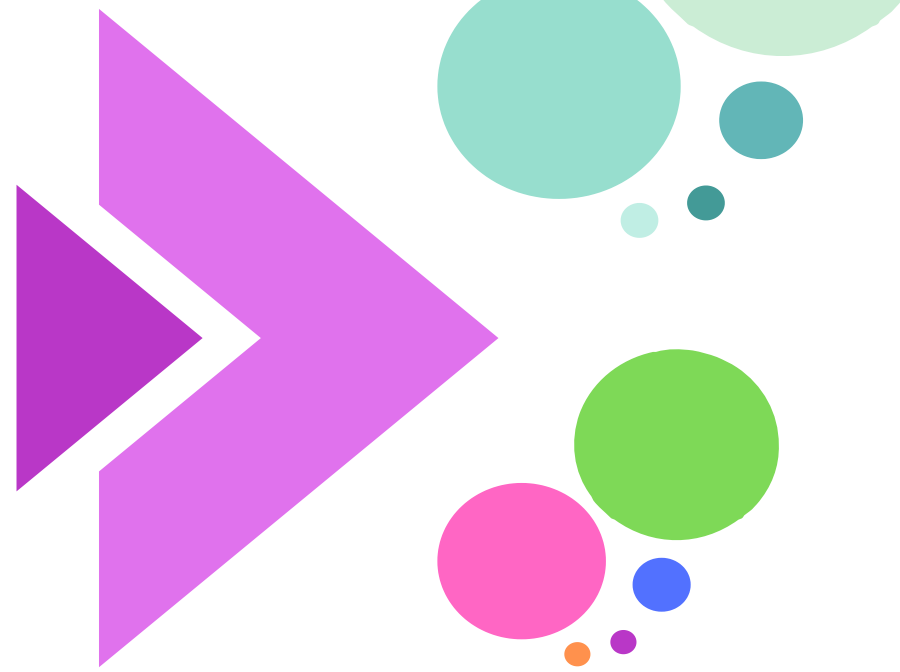
The RoSA is useful to students leaving school before the HSC because they can show it to potential employers or places of further learning.



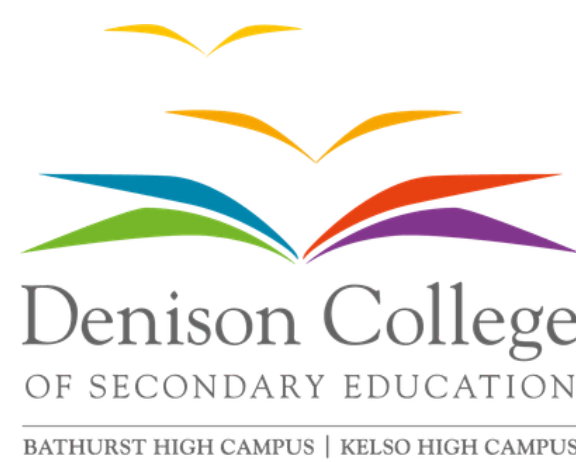

HSC PATTERN OF STUDY



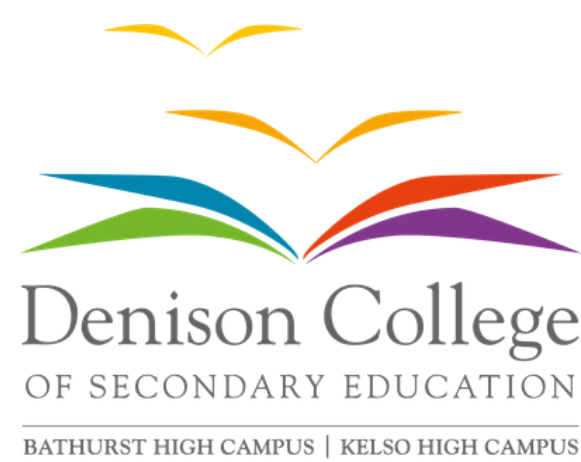
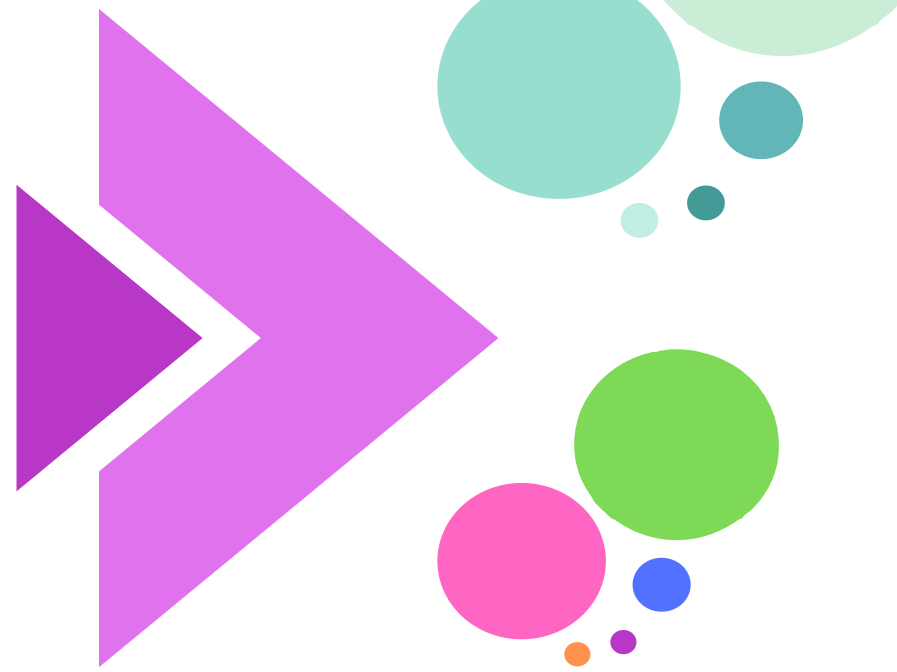

BEST HSC FOR ME

- The HSC is a credential and the highest level of attainment that secondary school students can achieve in NSW.
- The HSC mark for each course, which is calculated by NESA, shows your performance in the exam and assessments for that course.
- The HSC mark reflects the standard you achieved.



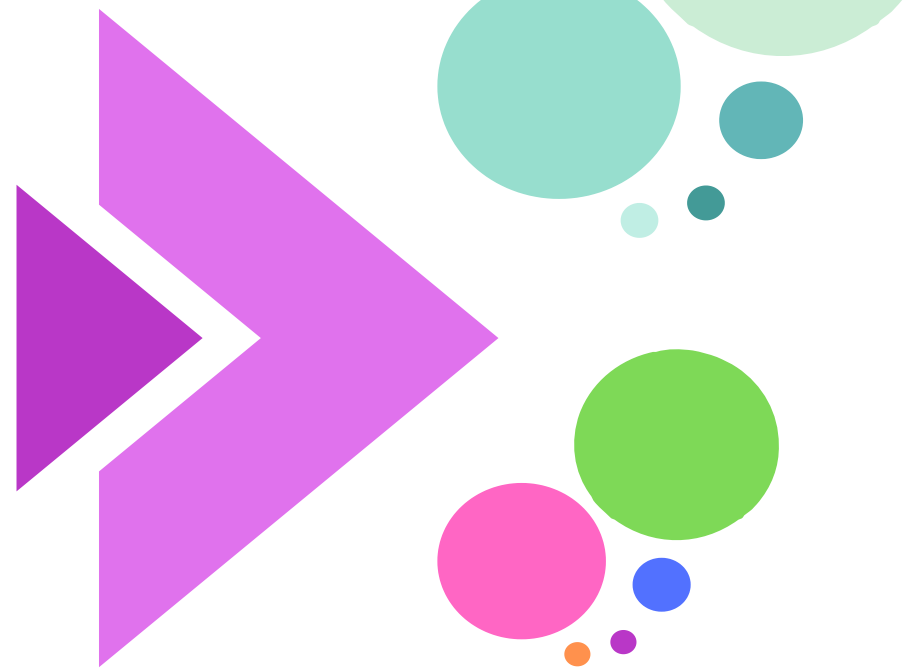

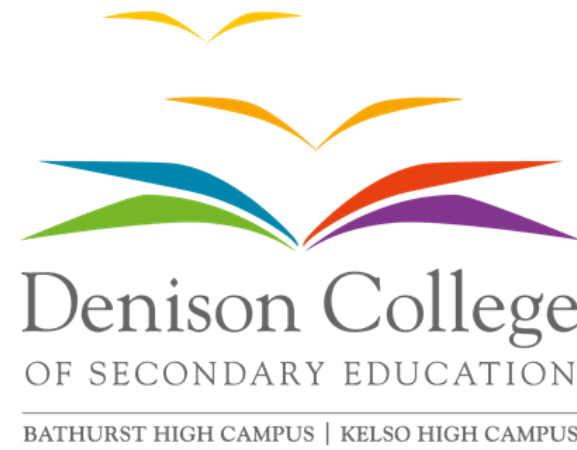
- Preliminary Course (Year 11: Terms 1-3)
- HSC Course (Year 11: Term 4; Year 12: Terms 1-3)
- AT LEAST 12 units in Year 11
- AT LEAST 10 units in Year 12
- English is compulsory
- Students must satisfactorily complete the Preliminary course before commencing the HSC in that course.

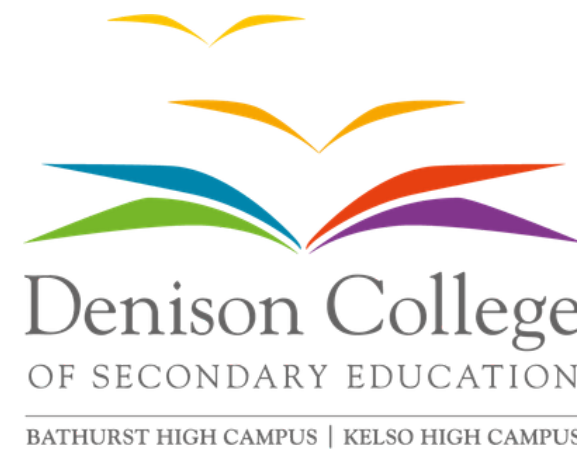
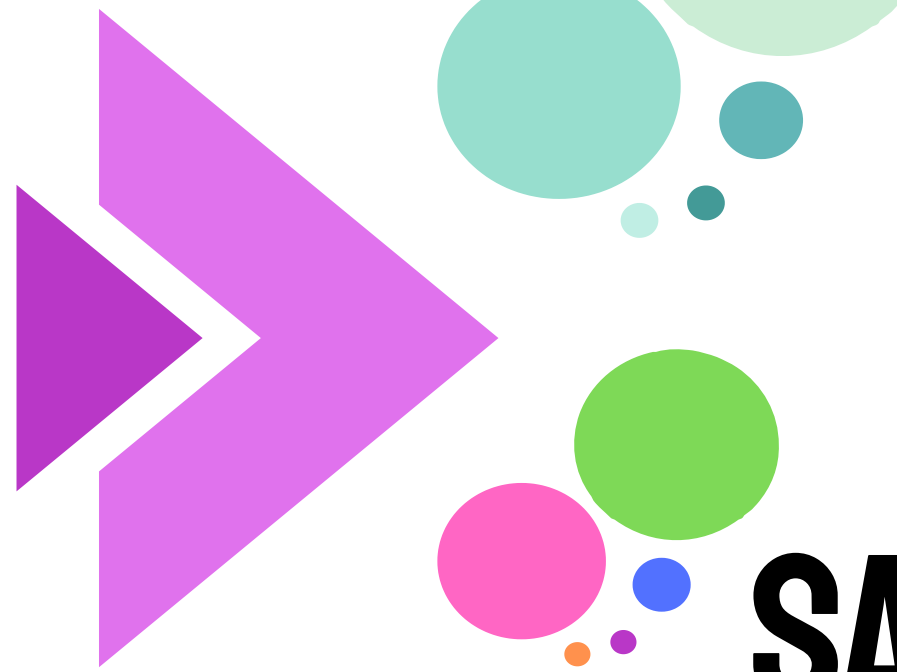
BEST HSC FOR ME

SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COURSE

Students must:

- **follow** the course developed or endorsed by NESA
- **apply themselves** with diligence and sustained effort to the set task and experiences provided in the course by the school; and
- **achieve** some or all of the course outcomes

VET Board Developed Courses require students to complete **mandatory work placement**.



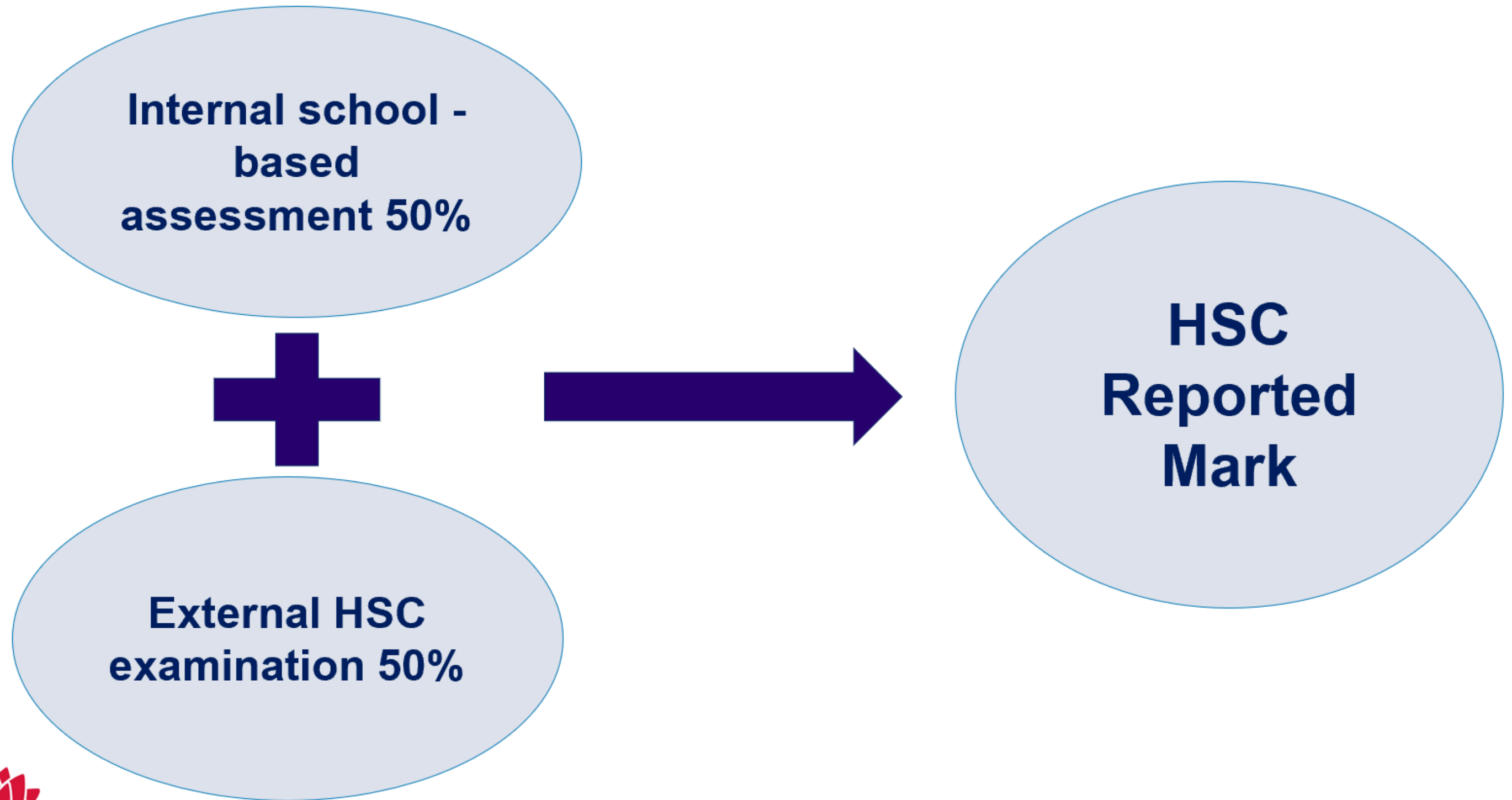
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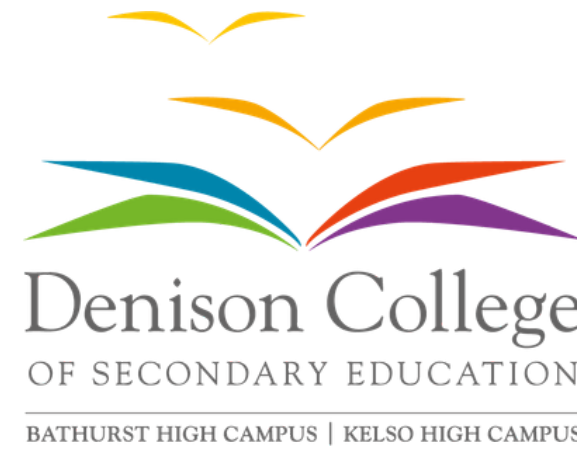
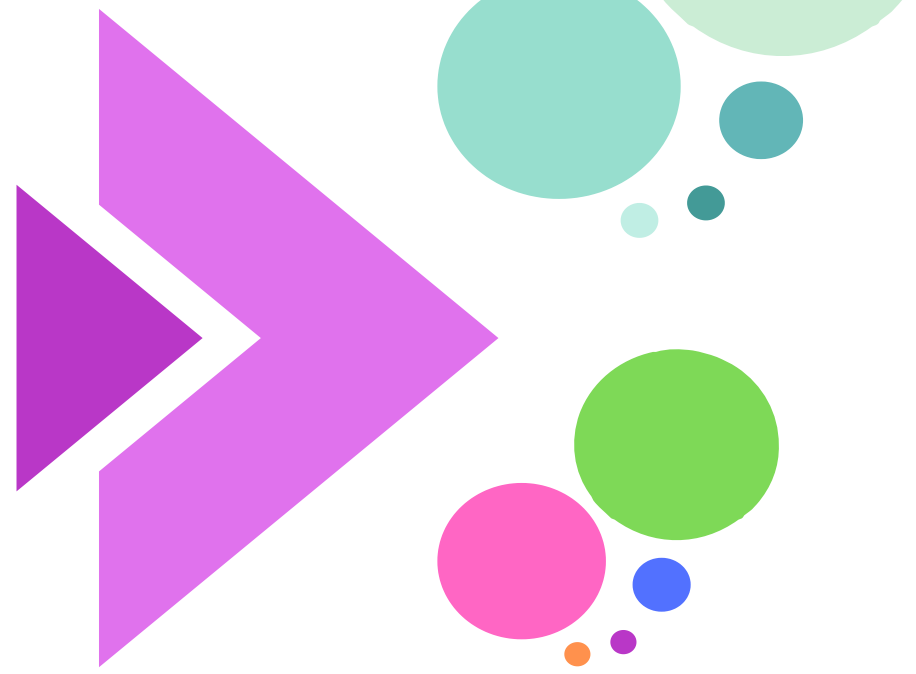
SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COURSE

Students must:

- complete HSC assessment tasks that contribute **in excess of 50 per cent** of available marks in courses where internal assessment marks are submitted; and
- sit for and make a **serious attempt** at any requisite Higher School Certificate examinations for a course

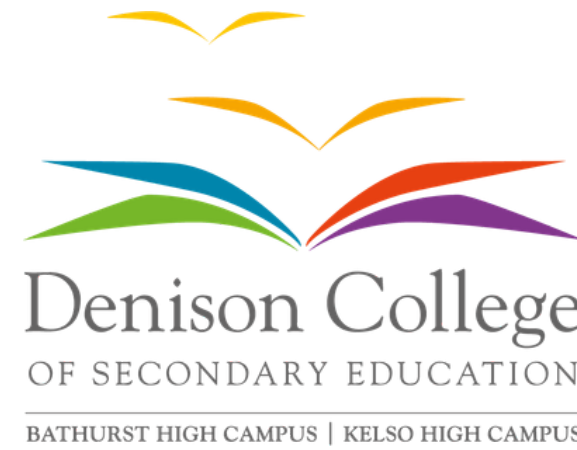
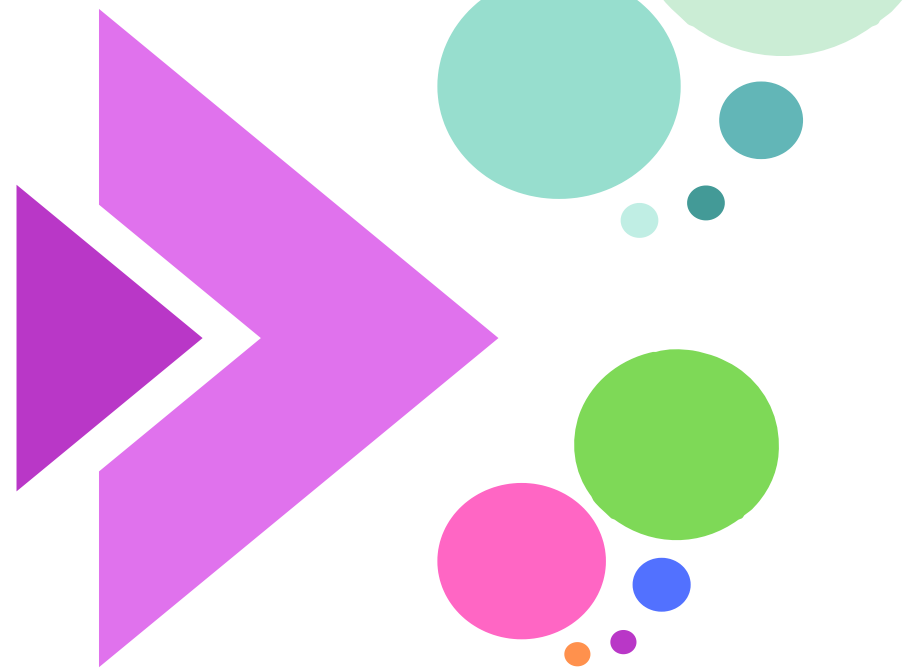


BEST HSC FOR ME

ATAR

The **Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)**:

- is for students wishing to gain a place at a university
- is calculated by the University Admissions Centre (UAC)
- is a rank **NOT** a mark, shows your position or ranking compared to other students in NSW and takes into account your achievement in the best 10 units of your HSC courses.
- provides information about how a student performs overall in relation to other students.
- Its only purpose is to help universities select students for courses

The average ATAR is usually around 70.00.

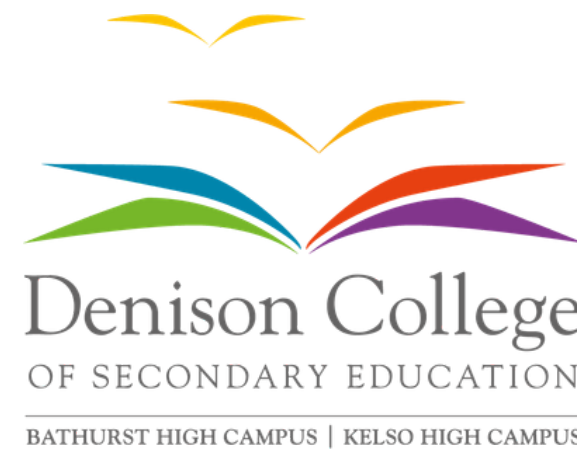
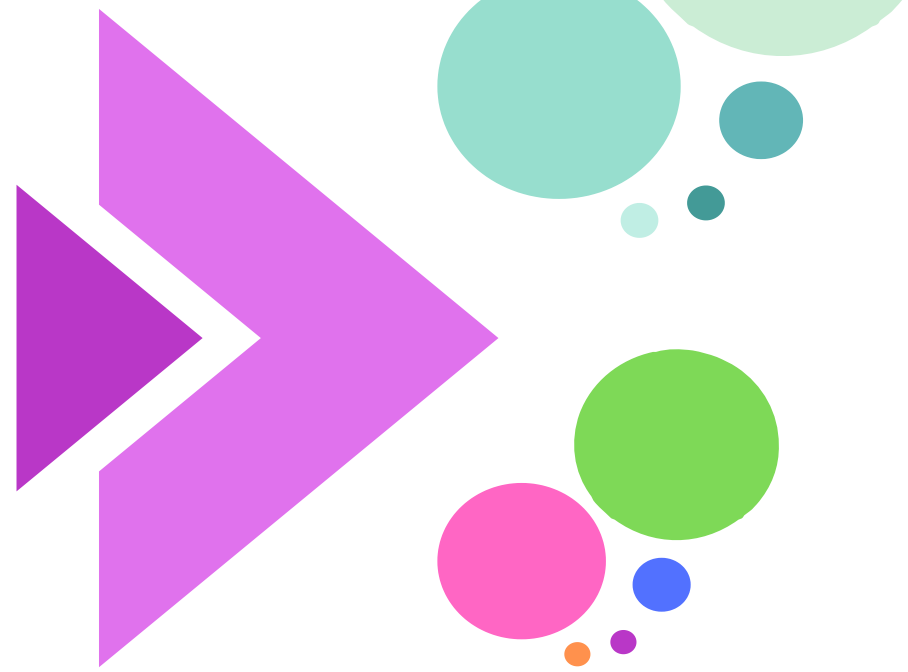

ATAR

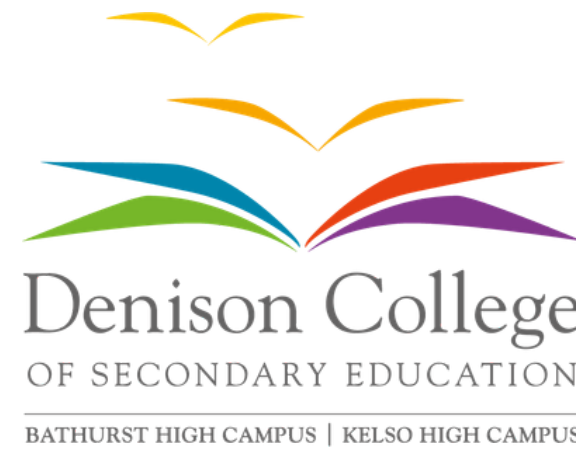
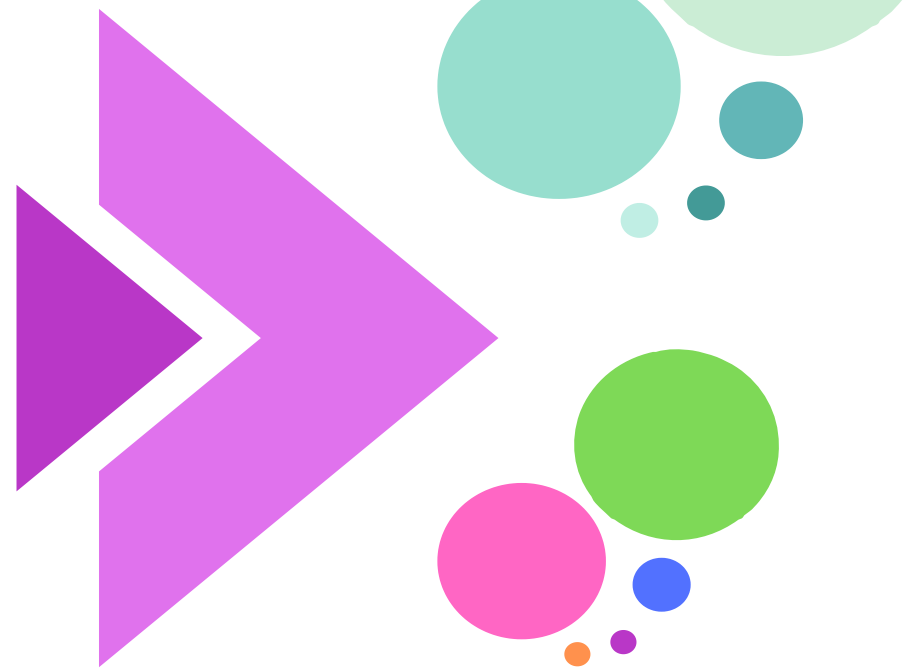

- Assistance on applications for students ATAR, early entry applications and general advice on university pathways will be provided to students in Year 11 from their Careers Advisers.

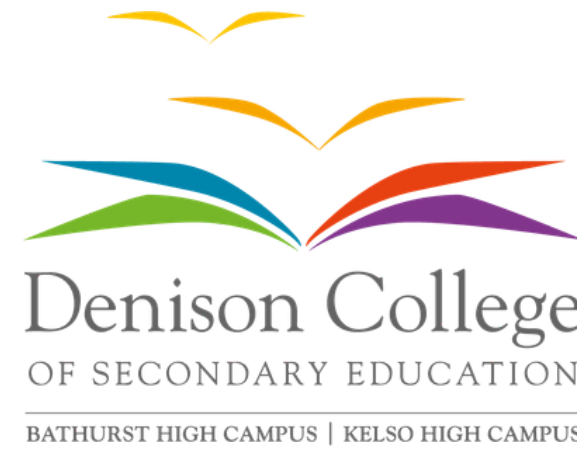
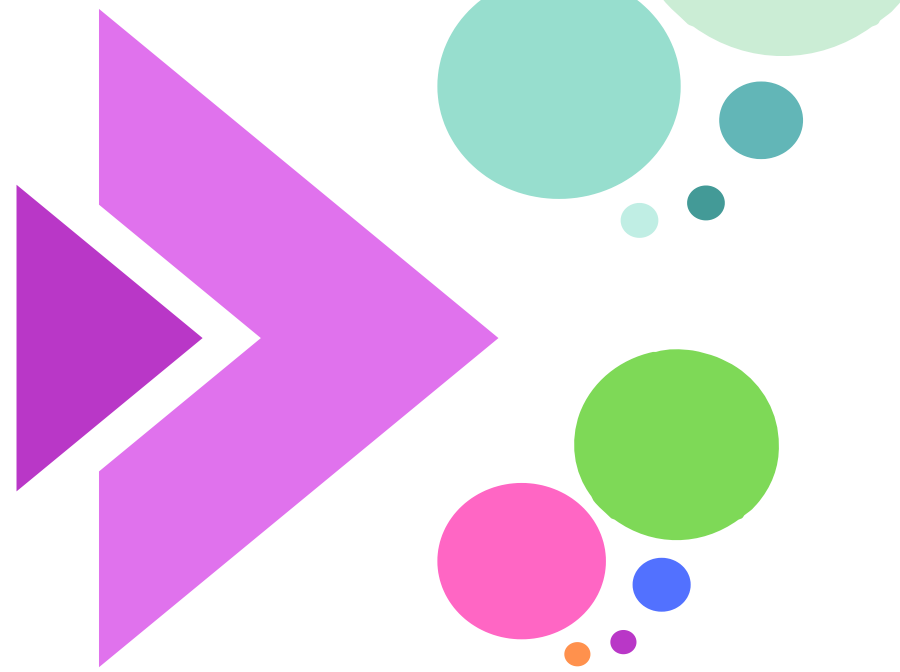


BEST HSC FOR ME

HSC MARKS AND THE ATAR: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

The most important thing to know is that HSC marks and the ATAR have different purposes:

- Your HSC mark for each course tells you about your performance in your exam and assessments. There's no quota as to the number of students who can achieve top marks.
- Your ATAR tells you about your position, or ranking, compared to other students in NSW and takes into account your achievement in all your HSC courses. Its only purpose is to help universities select applicants for their courses.
- You can think of it like a running race: your HSC is your time (and is not compared to anyone else's time), and your ATAR is your place (first, second, third, and so on).

MYTHS

X MYTH: To get a good ATAR and HSC marks, I need to choose subjects that scale well.

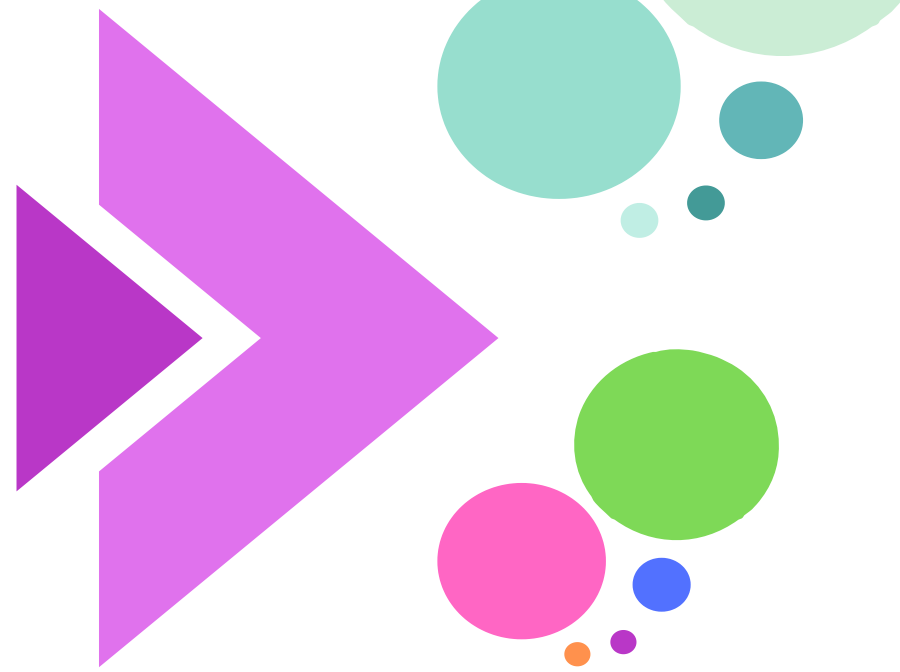


XMYTH: If I choose a particular combination of courses, I'll get the best ATAR.



XMYTH: Students who are approved for Disability Provisions receive extra HSC marks.



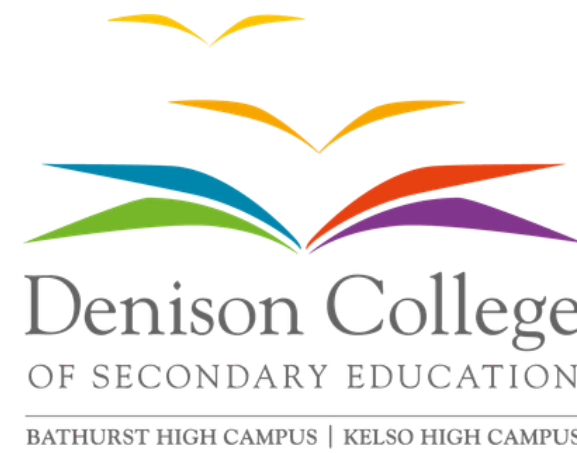
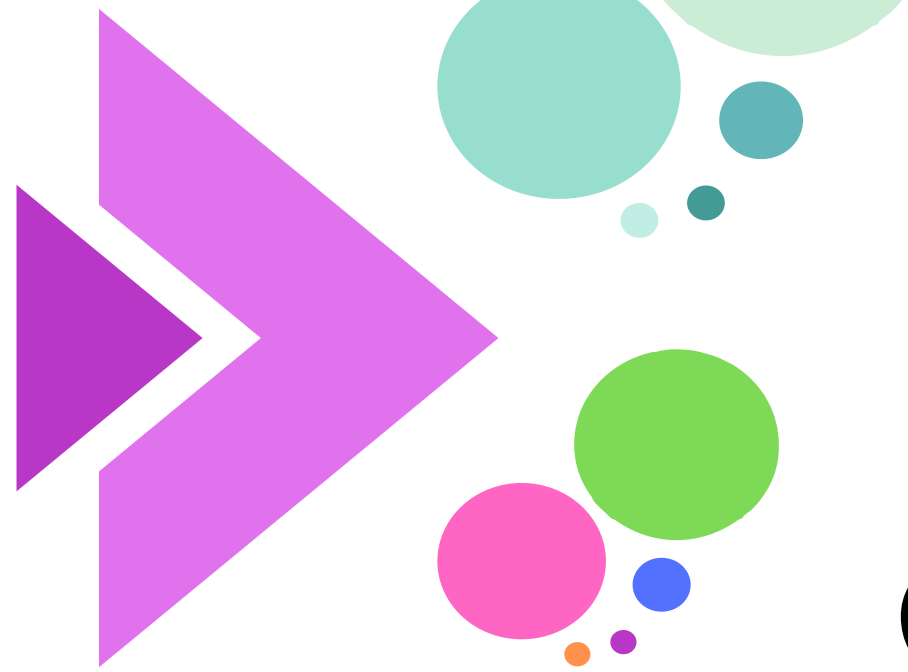


MYTHS

X MYTH: Internal assessments and exams make up 50 per cent of a student's mark but they are set and marked by each school. I'm disadvantaged because my school's tests and marking are harder.



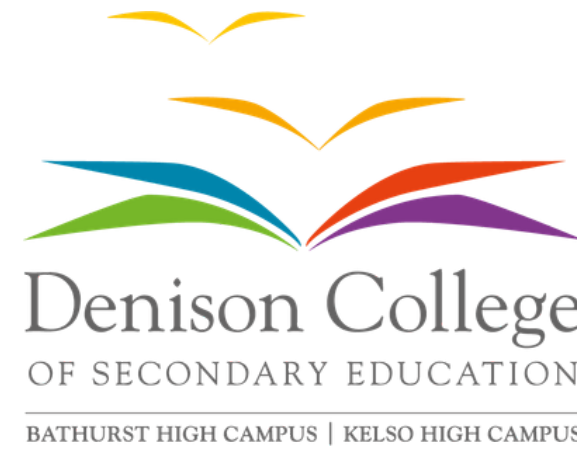
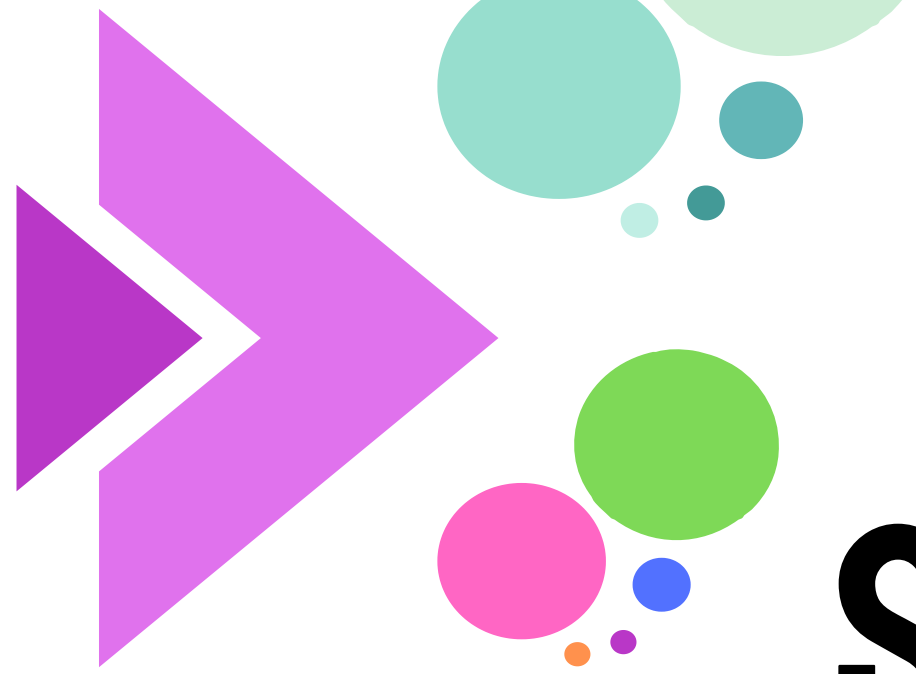
X MYTH: My HSC marks and ATAR will be pulled down by the performance of other classmates who don't perform well.

SBAT

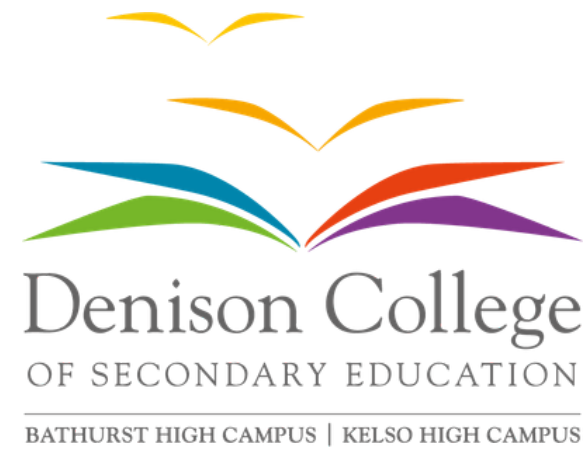
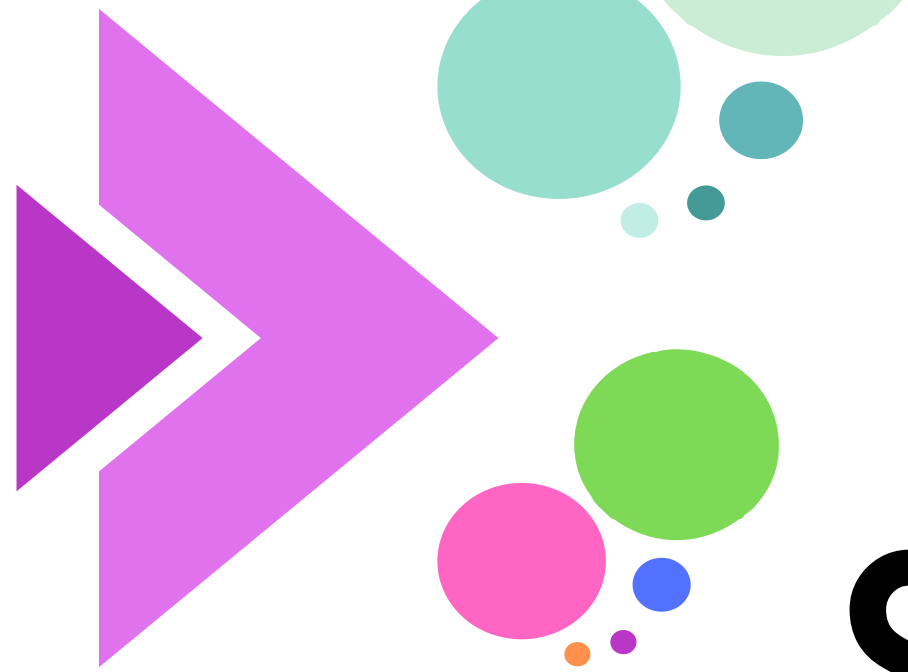
- Combine HSC, part-time paid work and structured work-based training delivered by a Registered Training Organisation e.g., school, TAFE
- Industry Based Learning
- Board Endorsed Status (cannot count to ATAR)
- Gives HSC unit credit for the 'on-the-job' component of SBATs



BEST HSC FOR ME

SBAT

- Students enter an approved School-Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship contract and are also entered for the appropriate VET course(s)
- If you are considering this, ensure you have a discussion with our campus Careers Advisers this evening in the Panorama Room

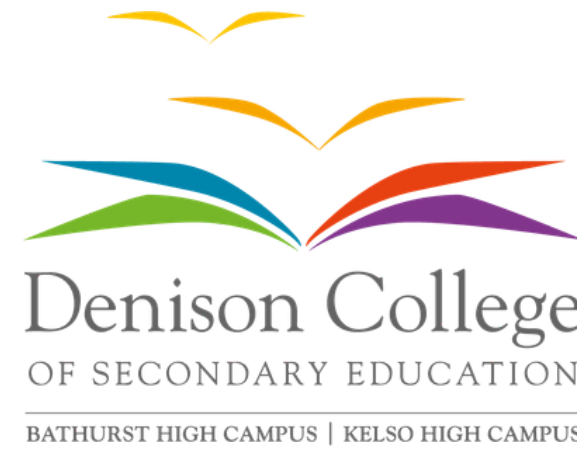
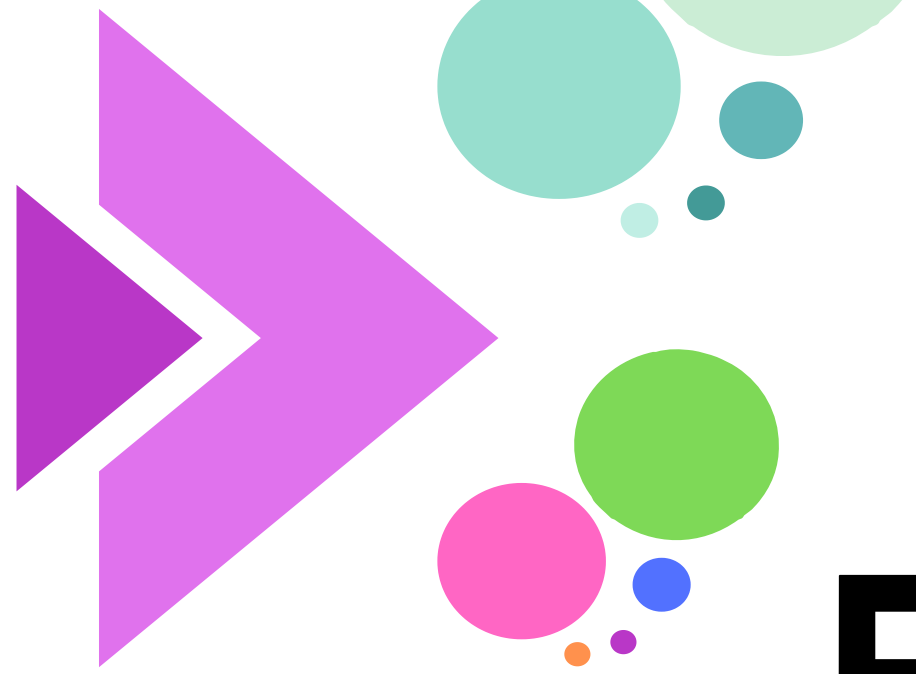

SUBJECT CHOICES

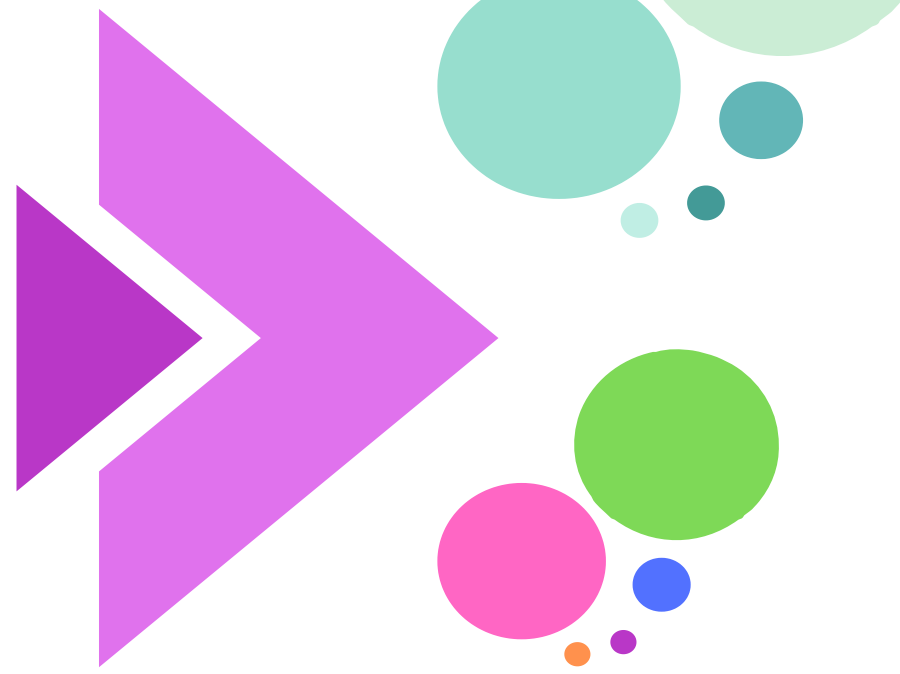
- Think about what you like, what you are good at, what you think you may want to do post-school and do what you can to achieve your best result in each course.
