What does the P&C aim to do?

The **Education Act 1990** outlines the key objectives of a **P&C Association**, which include

01	Promoting the interests of the school by:	bringing parents, citizens, students, and teaching staff into close cooperation to work towards the betterment of the school
02	Assist in providing facilities and equipment:	playing a crucial role in supporting the school by helping to acquire necessary resources and facilities.
03	Promote the recreation and welfare of the students:	contribute to the overall well-being of students by supporting activities and initiatives that enhance their experience at school
04	Encourage parent and community participation:	facilitating engagement of parents and the wider community in curriculum and other educational issues, especially in schools without a school council.

How we aim to achieve this:

We work to identify the school's main needs and plan effective ways to address them. This includes:

- Operating the School Uniform Shop.
- Organizing fundraising events, such as our Colour Run, to provide equipment, resources, and facilities for the school.
- Hosting community-building events like the Annual Welcome Back Event, Easter Egg Raffle, Mother's Day Stall, Father's Day Stall, and School Disco.
- Coordinating volunteer initiatives to support these activities and ensure they run smoothly.

Through these efforts, we aim to meet the school's needs while bringing the community together.



Our Achievements

Over the past few years, the P&C has proudly contributed to our school community through a range of successful initiatives and events that have brought families, students, and staff together. Highlights have included Welcome Back events, Election BBQs, Easter Raffles, Mother's and Father's Day Stalls, Colour Runs, School Discos
