### **Late Arrival/Early Departure**

If your child is late to school they must be signed in at the front office **by an adult**. Please walk your child in and see the friendly office staff. The same is expected for early departures.

#### **Attendance Goals**

This year our goal is to reduce the number of unexplained absences. An unexplained absence is when your child has been away and you have not let the school know the reason.

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- · being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unexplained on the student's record.


### **Canteen Helpers**







#### 8 WEEK BLOCK FOR \$120 AGE GROUP: SCHOOL YEARS 4 - 6
