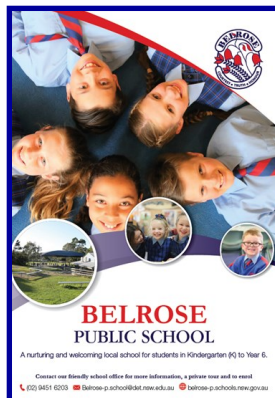

Instructions on how to book your appointment are listed below.

1. Go to above links or QR code when it opens
 2. From here enter your name, email, number of students you are booking for (i.e. if you have two children you enter them both and student name/s)
 3. Click GO
 4. Choose your teacher from the drop down box, then select the time you would like
 5. You will receive a confirmation email for you to keep as a reminder of your appointment time and Microsoft Team link. Please forward this email onto your partner, if required. Keep the email to launch meeting or add information to your calendar.
- Please contact me if you have any problems.

1. Are there any questions and concerns so far? Is there anything that I need to know about your child?
2. The teacher will communicate learning goals in reading, writing and/or numeracy and speak about social relationships, if required

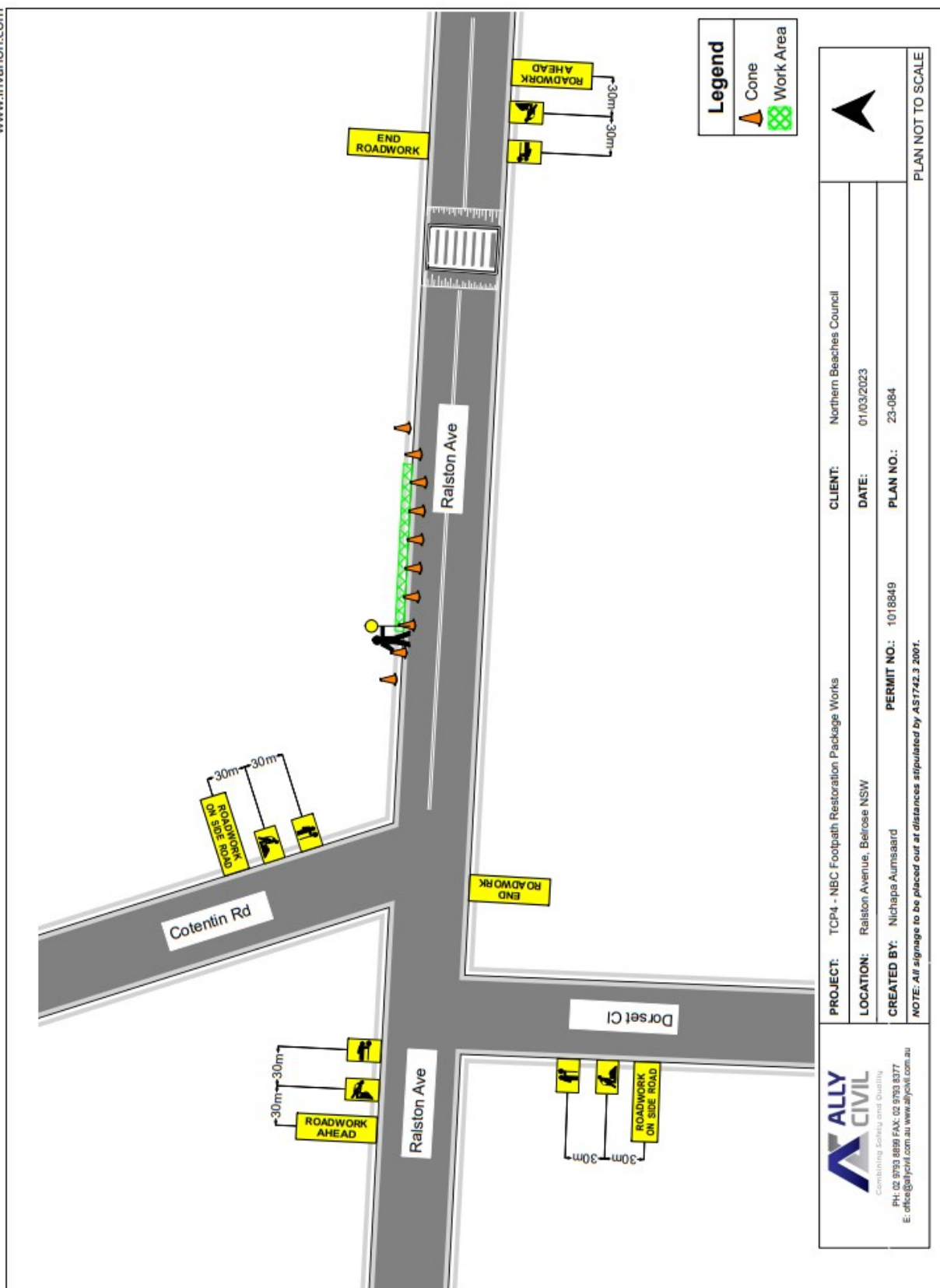

12 – 13 years: 3 km (4 laps) 3 bands



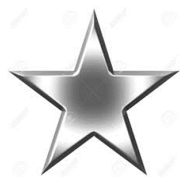
LIBRARY NEWS

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a great opportunity to encourage your child to enjoy quality literature over the 7 month challenge period.

You can find the link in the Student Portal under the learning section. Students can log in to the PRC Premier's Reading Challenge using their DoE (Department of Education user name and password) and add their name to the challenge. The URL is <https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/studentExperience.html#/>

The rules may be found there also. There are three levels K-2 (younger children can be read to by a parent or carer until they are able to try themselves), 3-4 and 5-6. Each level varies with the number of books.

In our School library, The Premier's Reading Challenge books have dots on the side of the book spine. **Yellow dots for K-2, Red dots for 3-4 and Blue dots for 5-6 levels.** Silver Stars are also for older reader levels. Students are also allowed 10 books of personal choice.



Each book that each student reads, will need to be added to their online reading record. Their lists need to be completed by 18 August. This list will then be checked and validated by Mrs Noor. Students will then, in due time, receive a Special Certificate signed by the Premier in recognition for their efforts.

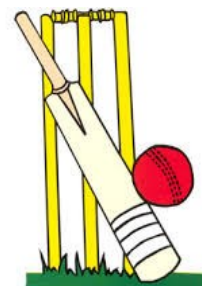

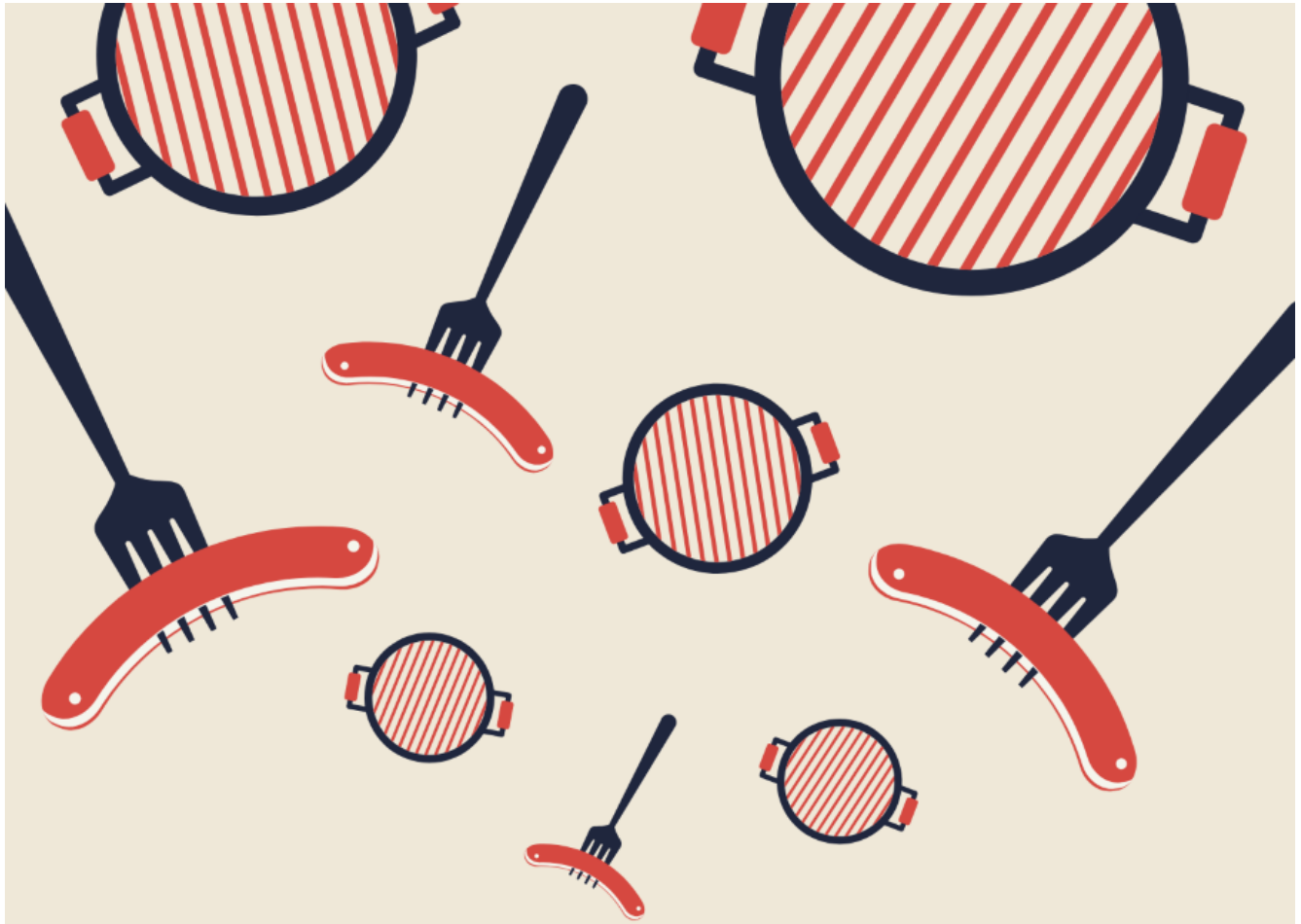
