A huge thank you to the families and grandparents who helped with transport and supported coaching on the day—it was a real team effort, both on and off the field.

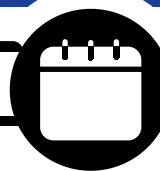
We look forward to proudly displaying the championship trophy at school very soon.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA ON SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH DISABILITY (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available within the school about the supports provided to students with disabilities. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

- Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:
- Year of schooling
 - Category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory, or social/emotional
 - Level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial, or extensive.

- This information assists schools to:
- Formally recognise the supports and adjustments supplied to students with disability in schools.
 - Consider how they can strengthen support for students with disabilities in schools.
 - Develop shared practices that they can review their learning programs and improve educational outcomes for students with disabilities.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability. The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage, and disclosure of personal information.
