PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

SPELLING BEE

On Friday in Week 4, Ivy D and Radja represented our school in the Premier's Spelling Bee, having won our school's Stage 2 and Stage 3 finals. They competed online against students across NSW. It was a nerve-wracking experience, but both students remained calm and correctly spelled the words asked. Ivy D and Radja were successful until the second-last round before making an error on an unfamiliar and challenging word. We are very proud of their achievement.

BOURNDA

Last Tuesday, a select group of our students attended Bournda for a day of learning, focusing on 'Digital Forests'. Students used iPads to learn methods and techniques of digital photography, photo editing and visual text construction. After exploring the environments of Scott's Bay, the students selected photos that portrayed the special features and used the Book Creator app to create a photo story.

Yesterday, our second group of students for this year headed to explore the 'Birds of Panboola Wetlands' at Pambula to discover the wonderful world of birds. They spent time bird watching with binoculars and recording their observations. They also had the opportunity to participate in the Bournda Bird Olympics Challenge!

Kindergarten, Year 1, and Year 2 students will participate in an environmental education program with the Bournda Environmental Education Centre (BEEC) and the Taronga Zoomobile on Monday, 15 September 2025. The program is an incursion that will be delivered on the school grounds.

Students will participate in a range of activities, learning about the importance of biodiversity and how they can contribute to its improvement at home and at school. The Zoomobile will provide hands-on learning about animals and their habitats.
