Learning Surveys

an you believe it's already been a busy start to the Term. Well done to our BPS students and Mrs Mitchell who represented BPs in the ANZAC Day march in Berowra. We are very proud of the respect you displayed.

On the first two days of this term we had a very special visit from Mrs Jennie Smith who has been enjoying travelling in her retirement. It was so lovely to see both the kids and teachers enjoying her visit. We held a special ceremony where Mrs Smith's teaching contribution to BPS over the years was acknowledged with a special plaque which is mounted above the Library door.

Our Stage 1 students have enjoyed visiting the Life Education Van and the excitement of seeing Harold has been playground discussion between the children for days.

We have started this term with opening more Playground areas up for the students to use during before school and break times. This was in response to our renewed focus on PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) and also in response to the Student Parliament motion. Student voice is an important part of BPS as we want students to feel like their ideas and opinion matter and that they are a part of the school wide decision-making process.

At the end of last term BPS conducted Learning Conversations. Students, with teacher support, led discussions with their parents about their learning goals in reading, writing and mathematics.

We thank those families who participated and those who filled in the Learning Conversation Surveys. 87% of parents surveyed rated the importance of students, parents and teachers participating in Learning conversations as Important or Very Important. 85% of parents felt Positive or Highly Positive about participating in Learning Conversations. 60% of parents felt the Learning Conversations were More Effective than traditional parent/teacher interviews.

The comments below are what some parents identified as the benefits of Learning Conversations. "Empowering child to be part of their education outcomes" "Understand more about what is happening in class so parent can support it" "The child gains confidence" "Child has the opportunity to have input into their own learning" "Children's reflection on their learning" "Children's opinion valued" "It gives the child the ability to reflect on their learning and recognise where they do well, and areas where they could improve. It gives them a chance to speak about their experience and thoughts" "Get to hear from your child what they are learning and how they are going!" "Was a very rewarding chat with my younger child and teacher" "Children are free to explain their own thoughts on their learning, with their teacher able to add more colour when needed" "It allows my child to be involved in the discussion about their learning achievements and needs and have greater accountability in what they need/ want to do to improve"






Of course, we had to try out the newly de-


signed courts for size and position.


