

This is a fantastic opportunity for our talented artists. Don't forget to send in the entry form with your artwork. We look forward to receiving your artwork entries by the due date - Friday 10th May for display in a gallery near you in 2025!

Operation Art is an initiative of the Children's Hospital at Westmead in association with the NSW Department of Education. Students are invited to create their own artwork and send this in to Mrs Lukic or the school office with the entry form by Friday 10th May. Artworks can be up to A2 (420mm x 594mm) in size and up to 5mm thick. Each school may select only 2 artworks to enter the competition.

All artwork entries received by schools this year will be exhibited in galleries across NSW in 2025, according to the regions where the students' schools are located.

- I also agree that, if not selected for Operation ArtBank, the artwork may be submitted for consideration for other Visual Arts activities supported by the NSW Department of Education such as international art exchanges with Japan, USA, etc. Schools and students will be advised if any works are selected for such activities.

This fortnight's Smiling Mind focus is Attention

At Home Activities

The more you practise belly breathing the more you will train your brain and your body to learn how to calm down and focus. Identify three times when you will use this breathing exercise over the next week, and note how you feel before and after. For example, if you are having trouble sleeping or if something at school is bothering you.

For this activity you will need to find a leaf. When you have found one, find a quiet space and, while you are standing up, hold it up in front of your face. Take a deep slow breath and blow slowly out onto the leaf. Notice how it moves gently with your breath. Continue this for ten deep, slow breaths and notice any changes. After you have done this activity take a moment to write down what you noticed. What happened when you blew softly? What happened when you blew a bit harder?

Stage 3

Has there been a time when you noticed that you were distracted and were able to bring your attention back to the task you were working on? Write about this experience. Where did your mind wander to when you were distracted? What did it feel like when you brought your attention back? Remember that we can always choose when to focus our attention and it is a skill we can get better at through practice.
