




















BULLYING NO WAY: NATIONAL WEEK OF ACTION 12 TO 16 AUGUST 2024.

Berowra Public School is participating in the Bullying No Way: National week of action - 12 to 16 August 2024.

By working collaboratively within our community, we can collectively help reduce bullying, or as we also refer to it 'mean on purpose'.

Parents and carers play an important role in helping your child understand bullying, and know how to respond to it.

If your child tells you about things at school, or you observe something in public that involves conflict or bullying, take the opportunity to talk about what bullying is. You can learn more about what defines bullying at bullyingnoway.

Questions you could ask

- What do you think bullying is?
- Have you seen it? How did you feel?
- Have you ever felt scared at school because of bullying?
- As well as me, who are the other adults you would talk to when it comes to things like bullying?
- Have you or your friends left other kids out on purpose? Do you think that was bullying? Why or why not?
- Have you ever tried to help someone who is being bullied? What happened?
 What would you do if it happens again?

Remind your child that bullying is never okay and discuss how they can respond safely if they experience or witness it.

Encourage them to seek help from a trusted adult and keep seeking support if needed.

By promoting open communication, we empower children to stand up against bullying and create a safer environment where everyone can feel that they belong.

What will we be doing at BPS?

During the week we will be having discussions with our classes on these focus areas using the Bullying No Way resources:

- Challenging stereotypes
- Promoting Empathy
- Embracing Diversity
- Positive Relationships
- Providing Support

As Stage 3 is away for the week, students will team up with their buddy over the next two weeks and together they will ill explore the 'Bullying No Way' resources to build awareness and support our school's Anti Bullying Procedures.







Boys Summer Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo <u>Completely black</u> shorts (no logos) White socks that are below mid calf Completely black school shoes Black polo fleece jacket Wide brimmed school hat

Sports Uniform

House colour polo shirt Completely black shorts or skorts (no logos) White socks that are below midcalf and track shoes

Wide brimmed school hat

Logos - School logo only on clothing, socks and hats, no other logos should be seen. Shorts - Shorts must be of an appropriate length. Bike shorts and short shorts are not appropriate for school.

Tights and Leggings - Black tights and/or leggings are only to be worn under school uniform.

Jewellery - Bracelets, necklaces, rings, and earrings (other than studs or small sleepers) are not permitted to be worn at school. Watches can be worn and in the case of Smart Watches, must be on 'school mode', as per the BPS mobile phone procedure.

Accessories - Nail polish or false nails are not permitted to be worn at school. Hair that touches the shoulder must be pulled back. Small hair accessories are permitted in the school colours of purple, yellow and black.
