Bush Camp Tea Gardens was an unforgettable
experience for all involved. Over the course of
4 days, students had the opportunity to participate in
a variety of outdoor activities that challenged them
physically and mentally. From navigating the high ropes
course to paddling through the waters in canoeing, every
activity was met with enthusiasm and determination.
The indoor rock-climbing wall saw students scaling new
heights, while the dual flying fox allowed them to fly
through the air next to a friend, overcoming their fears
and building confidence.

Throughout the camp, students demonstrated exemplary behaviour and teamwork. They supported one another on the giant swing, cheering on friends who were hesitant and celebrating each other's achievements. During the fossiling activity, students displayed curiosity and keen observation skills, eagerly searching for ancient creatures. The bush survival skills session was particularly engaging, as students learned how to build shelters and find safe drinking water.

The camp also included a rainforest walk and an exciting exploration of the sand dunes found on Worimi country. The rainforest walk provided a tranquil moment for students to connect with nature, listen to the sounds of the forest, and learn about the unique flora and fauna of the area. In contrast, the sand dunes offered an adventurous challenge with students racing up and down the dunes. From the feedback we've received from both parents and students, we can say that the camp was a resounding success, providing students with the opportunity to bond with their peers, push their boundaries, and create lasting memories. All Stage 3 parents should be extremely proud of their children.


# Kindergarten went to Mougamarra on a Teddy Bears Picnic.






