#### **Improving Communication on Student Attendance**

We are currently addressing the issue of unexplained student absences and are making improvements to our communication systems. Starting in Term 4, we will introduce a streamlined process where parents/carers will receive a text message if their child is absent. You will be able to respond directly with the reason for the absence, and a follow-up reminder will be sent if no response is received after a few days.

Further details on how to use this system will be shared soon. In the meantime, we aim to reduce unexplained absences to zero. If you receive a paper copy asking for an explanation of student absence, can you assist us in our aim by returning the slip promptly to the class teacher. Congratulations to KT and 56R, who currently have no unexplained absences. By working together, we can ensure that all absences are explained within 7 days, as required by the NSW Education Act.

#### TTFM Parent Survey






























# ASQUITH MUSICALE @ ASQUITH GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL

# This fortnight's Smiling Mind focus is Empathy At Home Activities

Thank You to my Teacher Wishing well for others can make us feel good too. Write a thank you note to your teacher for something they did this week, it could be for helping you with your work, listening to you, or teaching you something that you liked.

Stage 2

Temperature check Ask your family members how they are feeling today. Thinking about and trying to understand other people's thoughts and emotions can help us to build empathy. Using a thermometer picture to colour in how they are feeling: Cold could mean sad or upset and warm or hot could mean happy and excited.

Stage 3

Empathy X-Ray
We show our emotions on our faces and through our behaviour and we feel our emotions in our bodies. When someone is feeling sad, where do you think they feel this sadness in their bodies? Imagine that you have an X-Ray machine that can see where people feel emotions.

Draw a picture of the body and then draw or colour in where and what it looks like inside when someone is upset.






