## **Teddy Bear's Picnic**



Wishing all our families a happy and safe Term 3 holidays. We look forward to seeing you back for our exciting learning adventures in Term 4.




CANTEEN & UNIFORM SHOP - These essential services continue to run smoothly thanks to our dedicated volunteers. Your support makes a real difference.



# This fortnight's Smiling Mind focus is Acts of Kindness

At Home Activities

Helping at home

Acts of kindness are intended to help others and is one way of showing someone that you care about them. What is an act of kindness that you can do this week at home? Examples: helping with the dishes, letting someone else go first, taking care of a pet, making a get-well card for a sick friend, hugging someone to make them feel better. Choose one act of kindness to perform this week.

Once you have done this, draw how your act of kindness made you and your family member feel.

Stage 2

Acts of Kindness Challenge
Doing something nice for someone else often makes us, in turn, feel better also. Pick one act of kindness you are going to do this week and ry to do it every day. It doesn't have to be a big act! It can be something small like making sure you smile every time you say hi to someone. As you are performing the act of kindness, notice how it makes you feel. Does it make you feel good? How does it make the other person feel?

Stage 3

Compliments

Acts of kindness are one way of showing people that you care about them and helps to build relationships and community. This week, practise acts of kindness by giving 5 people a genuine compliment. Afterwards, reflect on these questions: How did the compliment make the person feel? How did giving a compliment make you feel?
