Lastly we saved the best for last -McDonald's. When I was ordering I felt kind of excited because I had never been to McDonald's on a school day. After McDonald's it was home time.
























MY TRIP TO CANBERRA BY ELLIANA W

- 3. If you cannot attend the Book Fair pre-pay online using the wish list brought home by your child the day/s prior to the Book Fair. Students will browse at the Book Fair and create a wish list with their class during school time on the Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 8. If using this method, just add up the cost of the books you wish to purchase (cross out any books from their wishlist you don't want to purchase), pay online. Your child MUST return the wish list stating the book titles and the receipt number to their class teacher on Thursday 11th September (or prior).
 Wish list orders will be filled and given to the students the week after the Book Fair.

We will not be accepting cash for the Book Fair. All purchases earn rewards for the school to go towards buying more books for our library to keep up with student interests and help to develop their love of reading.
