## MORRIS GLEITZMAN VISIT

On Tuesday, 2nd September, our school was thrilled to welcome celebrated children's author Morris Gleitzman for a special visit with students in Years 3-6. Morris, whose books such as the Once series have captivated readers around the world, shared insights into his writing journey and answered a host of eager students' questions.

During his talk, Morris gave us a behind-the-scenes look at what it takes to write a novel. He explained that, on average, it takes him about nine months to complete a book, though this can vary—his quickest book took just four weeks, while the longest, the final book in the Once series, took two years! Morris revealed that for this last book, he actually wrote three different versions before choosing the one that felt exactly right.

Students were fascinated to learn about Morris' writing process, with many surprised to hear that he finds starting a novel the hardest part. He admitted that coming up with the first sentence is his biggest struggle—proving that even famous authors face challenges. Interestingly, Morris didn't begin writing novels until he was 32 years old, showing that it's never too late to start something new.

One of the most important lessons Morris shared was about the role of problems and complications in stories. He explained that if characters' lives were always happy, there wouldn't be much to read about! It's the challenges that make stories exciting and meaningful.

The session finished with a lively Q&A, where students asked Morris about meeting other famous authors. He shared that he's met many at literary festivals, but jokingly lamented that he's never met J.K. Rowling—and now there's too much money blocking her front door for anyone to get in! Morris also talked about how he finds inspiration for his characters, saying he "befriends" them in his imagination as he gets to know them.

Morris Gleitzman's visit left students inspired and eager to read and write their own stories. We thank Morris for sharing his experiences and encouraging our budding authors to embrace creativity, challenges, and imagination.

Kindergarten are studying living and non-living things in Science.














# SYDNEY OPERA HOUSE

### PURCHASE AT THE BOOK FAIR USING EFTPOS (NO CASH ACCEPTED).

\*Please note - If we run out of stock due to limited supplies - use the 'prefer not to queue' method below to order your books.

### ATTENDING THE BOOK FAIR BUT PREFER NOT TO QUEUE ...

If you come to the Book Fair but prefer not to queue, use the QR code displayed to pay - complete a pre-payment form/wish list stating the book titles ordered and the receipt number, then leave it in the pre-paid box. Your order will be filled and given to your child the week after the fair. (Do not take the books on Book Fair day)

### IF YOU CANNOT ATTEND THE BOOK FAIR ...

Pre-pay online using the wish list brought home by your child the day/s prior to the Book Fair. Students will browse at the Book Fair and create a wish list with their class during school time on the Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 8. If using this method, just add up the cost of the books you wish to purchase (cross out any books from their wishlist you don't want to purchase), pay online. Your child MUST return the wish list stating the book titles and the receipt number to their class teacher on Thursday 11th September (or prior). Wish list orders will be filled and given to the students the week after the Book Fair.
