Dear Parent / Guardian(s),

The Lions Eye Health Program is offering Free Vision Screening for children. This screening will be conducted by Lennox Head Lions Club at Bexhill School on Friday 05 / 09 / 2025 between 9.30 am - 1.50pm Over 80% of what children learn is processed through their eyes. Untreated eye conditions can affect a child's development. We have found 1 in 5 children in Australia have undetected vision problems. Screenings can help identify

children who may require further examination by an optometrist.

Lions Members have been specifically trained to perform four vision screening assessments:

1 Visual Acuity - using a Lea 3m -15-line symbol chart

- 2 Colour Vision using a Quick 6 basic colour screening book
- 3 Depth Perception using a stereo holograph screening tool
- 4 Spot Vision Screener state of the art portable camera designed to screen for

Myopia (near sightedness) Hyperopia (far sightedness), Astigmatism (blurred vision), Anisometropia (unequal refractive power) Strabismus (eye misalignment) and

Anisocoria (unequal pupil size).

Each children's screening takes just a few minutes to perform. There is **no physical contact made with the child, and no eye drops are administered.** A comprehensive student report will be provided. If a vision problem is detected, this will be recorded on the child's result sheet. We will be encouraging you to seek a further eye assessment with an eye health professional.
