The Education and Wellbeing of our students is of the utmost importance to us, and we look forward to working with you.



At Blacktown North Public School, we were delighted to host Variety – The Children's Charity's disability awareness program, *Just Like You*.








Our school has proudly joined Variety in its commitment to ensuring our students are engaged in reflecting on their own roles and actions as citizens in their school and community.
