





Staying informed helps ensure students don't miss out on the wonderful opportunities available to them, and timely paperwork supports all the behind-the-scenes organisation that brings these experiences to life.

On that note, the **final instalment** for our school **camp** is **due soon**.

Notes about camp will be going home during the first few weeks back next term.

It is also important to remind our students and families about **behaviour expectations**. While on camp, students will be expected to follow reasonable directions and instructions by both teachers and venue staff. Our students will need to demonstrate Blackwell's virtues of responsibility, kindness, respect, tolerance, patience and self-discipline.

Camp invitations **will be withdrawn** if students can not follow our school rules and expectations.

We know camps are a great opportunity for your children to push their boundaries, discover friendships and experience new adventures. For some children, school camp is one of the highlights of their primary school days. However, for some children (and their parents), the thought of staying away overnight can create a little anxiety.



To help your child, you could try

- talking to your child about how they feel about going to camp. Ask what
  they are looking forward to or what they may be worried about? Be
  positive and even share your own positive camp experiences.
- Reducing the sense of the unknown find out about the rough schedule of the camp/ the sleeping arrangements etc... (this information is coming home next term)
- Having sleepovers an occasional sleepover at a family member's or friend's home might help reduce anxiety.
- Practising independence skills can your child turn on and off the shower in the right order, brush their hair, keep their dirty clothes together or apply sunscreen? etc...
- Preparing for camp with your child make a list, purchase/find items, and label items together.
- Talking to your child's teacher. We appreciate knowing any extra information to make your child's time at camp more enjoyable.

Recently, our Year 5 students voted on the design for their **Year 6 2026 shirt**. Order forms will be coming home early next term. We place orders for our Year 6 shirts at the end of Term 4, so the stock arrives early the following year. This allows our students more opportunities to wear their special shirts. To help with our organisation, if your child is not returning in 2026, please let your child's teacher know ASAP.

A note was sent via Sentral for Year 6 students about ordering special items to have signed during the last week of Term 4. In the past, many students have either gotten their Year 6 shirts signed by their friends, buddies and teachers

or opted to purchase one of these special items to get signed. To ensure delivery before the last week of school and signing day, money and the order form will need to be completed by the due date on the form.

# **ONLINE SAFETY**

As parents, we all want our children to be safe, happy and thriving—both online and off. The NSW Department of Education's **Digital Devices and Online Services Policy** requires students to use technology responsibly, respectfully and only when it supports learning or wellbeing. Social media is *not* a free-for-all; it comes with real risks that can impact children's mental health, safety, and development.

The Australian Government's new Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Act 2024 now bans children under 16 years from holding accounts on platforms like TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook, X, Reddit—and soon, YouTube—recognising the dangers of early and unsupervised social media exposure.

We urge you, as caring parents, to take this seriously. Reconsider your child's access to TikTok, Snapchat, Roblox, and similar platforms. Every account we delay or limit is a gift of time—time for children to build confidence, resilience, and face-to-face friendships *before* confronting the relentless, often unforgiving world of social media.
