RINCIPAL'S MESSAG

High Performance and Gifted Education

During 2025 all government schools have been asked to review existing policies, programs and procedures relating to High Performance, Gifted Education-HGPE. Our two Staff Development days in Term 2 – Monday, 28th and Tuesday, 29th April 2025 have been set aside for all staff to attend learning modules dedicated to this topic.

The NSW Education Department has established a list of principles to assist government schools in this area.

The following principles have guided the development of the High Performance, Gifted Education (HPGE) policy:

- All students, regardless of background or personal circumstances, require access to learning programs that meet their learning needs and support to aspire to, and achieve, personal excellence.
- Our commitment to high expectations for all students includes high potential and gifted students.
- Achieving excellence for high potential and gifted students is underpinned by effective school environments including quality teaching, learning and leadership.
- Potential exists along a continuum, where differing degrees of potential require differing approaches and levels of adjustment and intervention.

The domains of potential describe the four broad categories of natural abilities found in the works of Françoys Gagné'. These definitions apply to all students, including high potential and gifted students.

The domains of potential may not be mutually exclusive and are highly influenced by one another.

- Intellectual domain refers to natural abilities in processing, understanding, reasoning, and the transfer of learning.
- **Creative domain** refers to natural abilities in imagination, invention and originality.
- **Social-emotional** refers to natural abilities in self-management and relating to and interacting with others.
- Physical domain refers to natural abilities in muscular movement and motor control.

Potential exists along a continuum, where differing degrees of potential require differing approaches and levels of adjustment and intervention.

High potential students

High potential students are those whose potential exceeds that of students of the same age in one or more domains. Their potential may be assessed as beyond the average range across any domain. They may benefit from an



enriched or extended curriculum and learning opportunities beyond the typical level of students the same age.

Gifted students

Gifted students' potential significantly exceeds that of students of the same age in one or more domains. These students typically develop talent and achieve mastery notably faster than their age peers. They may benefit from an extended curriculum and learning opportunities significantly beyond the typical level of students the same age.

Highly gifted students

Highly gifted students' potential vastly exceeds that of students of the same age in one or more domains. Highly gifted students have potential assessed in the top 1% or less of age peers. Highly gifted students may require specific and more significant curriculum adjustments to meet their learning and wellbeing needs.

The High Potential and Gifted Education Policy applies to all NSW Department of Education school staff and teachers.

The department is committed to supporting all students to achieve their educational potential.

The policy recognises that high potential and gifted students require support to optimise their growth and achievement.

Indicators may include:

- Ability to comprehend materials several grade levels above their age peers.
- Surprising emotional depth & sensitivity at a young age.
- Strong sense of curiosity they ask lots of questions.
- Enthusiastic about unique interests and topics
- Mature for their age, often prefer adult conversations and company
- Quirky sense of humour
- Have original ideas and often use their own approach to assignments
- Often self-taught, sometimes reading as young as three.

Blackwell Public School will continue to support a diverse array of learning opportunities both within the classroom and beyond. As a school we are committed to providing the best learning environment for all our students. We continue to seek avenues that enable our students to shine and celebrate their talents and skills.

Hopefully this will enable us to "find the potential, develop the talent and make the difference"






SUPPORT UNIT NEWS

We have come to the end of an exciting term. The students have enjoyed the term and have worked hard so we hope they enjoy a relaxing holiday break.

On Friday April 11th, all of Blackwell will participate in a fun day. This term, Mrs Hudswell is organising a Mad Hatters Day. Students can wear mufti clothes and bring a 'Mad Hat' from home. You may wish to make this with your child or you may already have a suitable hat at home.

Our PAWS lunch will be on Thursday April 9th. This will be for anyone who received a principals award this term and our elected SRC members. They will have a BBQ lunch under the sails at the front of our school.

Homework

Blackwell has a no homework policy, however home reading is still expected daily. Students will be bringing home a "Home Reading Log", where you will be required to enter the title of the book that they bring home from school and read. Students may bring the same book home for the week to be read two or three nights in a row; this is to develop fluency and expression.

OTHER INFORMATION

Messages for the teacher/parent concerns - If some information is required for the day, please write a note to the class teacher and forward it with your child. Otherwise, a message can be left at the office for the teacher. If you would like your child's teacher to call you to discuss something, please arrange a time, outside school hours or in their RFF time.

Mrs Rachel Bulluss <u>Rachel.bulluss@det.nsw.edu.au</u> (Stage supervisor) is also available to answer questions and concerns.

School Pack – Please pay for your child's school pack as soon as possible. It has everything students require from pencils and glue sticks to whiteboard markers and books to do their schoolwork in. This equipment remains at school for school use. Please note that Stage based incursions and excursion are an additional cost). Our school pack is now \$50 per child.

Crunch and Sip - Students participate in "Crunch and Sip" each day in the morning session. There is no set time for this, as it is scheduled at an appropriate time for the class. Students are only permitted to have <u>fresh fruit</u> <u>or vegetables and/or water.</u> The portions, however, need to be <u>small</u> so that they are consumed quickly and class disruptions are minimised. A very large apple can take a child a very long time to finish so, if possible, please cut the apple into quarters/eighths/or a slinky as this is more manageable for them to eat. It is best if it is kept in a separate container, not packed with recess and lunch.

School uniforms - Please label all items brought to school by your child. We ask that students **not** wear nail polish or jewellery to school (sleepers/studs and watches/Fitbits excluded) and that they adhere to the uniform as close as possible. This includes black leather or jogger styled shoes (no bright shoelaces please). Ribbons or bows in the hair should be school colours — navy, blue or white.

Extra equipment – If you have not done so, please provide your child with a labelled;

- paint shirt
- library bag
- headphones

Sport - We ask if students could wear joggers and our sports uniform on Tuesdays so they are comfortable to participate in sport/exercise.

Money Procedures - Any money sent to school should be in a labelled envelope and handed in at the school office.

Library Day - Our school library is open every afternoon and every morning, with the exception of Tuesday. Books can be borrowed during this time as well as during class library times.

We encourage <u>ALL</u> students to be regular book borrowers. Class borrowing is on the following days;

Attendance and Absences - Regular attendance at school for every student is essential if students are to achieve their potential and increase their career and life options. Schools, in partnerships with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. Optimum attendance should be above 95% for each school term. If you are planning to take your child out of school for a holiday of 3 weeks or more please submit an application to the principal prior to travelling. The Department of Education requires a note to explain all absences. If your child is absent you will receive a SMS notifying you that your child has been marked absent and you can reply with reasons why. Alternatively, please send a note to school with your child upon returning to school. If your child is absent more than 2 days in a row, please consider obtaining a doctor's certificate to explain the absence.


