We have been looking at characters in narratives in K-2 and how authors can use a variety of techniques to portray emotions and traits. The students have used some of these techniques to create their own characters and really enjoyed making comic strips to tell simple stories about these characters using Pig the Pug as their inspiration. It was a great way for the students to also express their humour!

In numeracy the students have been enjoying completing a daily review to revise concepts that have already been taught and to strengthen some of the skills that are needed as we move onto more challenging concepts. This has been a great way for them to also share their own thinking when they solve mathematical problems and there have been some great discussions and moments where they get to learn from each other.


















In mathematics students have compared and described features of three-dimensional objects by making and exploring models, sketching and using diagrams. They had fun constructing and deconstructing nets of everyday three-dimensional objects that we find around the house. Students used formal units of litres and millilitres to estimate, compare and measure capacity with various size containers.

Students are very creative with their writing using similes and stanzas to enhance their visual ideas in a poem.




It was lovely to see so many families and friends visit our school for Book Week and Public Education Week.





NOTES

- . For the AGM to be valid, at least 14 days' notice must have been given to members
- The quorum at the AGM is as stated in the Constitution
- The AGM cannot continue if the audited financials are unavailable for receipt and adoption. The meeting must be postponed until they can be presented.
- Only members can nominate and be elected for a position at the AGM. To be considered a member, an
 application for membership must have been received prior to the close of the general meeting preceding the
 AGM. Any person who applies for membership for the first time at the AGM will only be considered a member
 after the close of the AGM.
- Any existing member that wishes to remain a member for the coming year is required to pay the annual subscription before the close of the AGM
- Any existing member who does not pay their annual subscription at the AGM will be unable to continue in an
 elected position until such time as the annual subscription is paid and the member register is updated

President

- Chairing of P&C Association meetings
- Ensuring the P&C Association's objectives are met
- Ensuring that the P&C Association takes part in decision-making processes in the school
- Setting up lines of communication with the Principal and establishing a positive and constructive relationship with the school
- Establishing a positive relationship with the school
- Creating a welcoming environment and fostering fair participation
- Setting agendas
- Adherence to the constitution, by-laws, rules, policies, and procedures
- Acting as the P&C Association's spokesperson
- Being a signatory on the P&C Association's bank accounts

Vice Presidents

- Backupchairperson
- Supporting the president, secretary, and treasurer in their roles
- Shadowing the treasurer and secretary to act as a back-up
- Often assigned oversight of key operations, e.g. canteen, uniform shop, WWCC
- Signatory to P&C Association bank accounts


Secretary

- Preparation of meeting agendas in conjunction with the president
- Sending notifications of meetings to members
- Taking minutes at P&C Association meetings
- Preparation of draft minutes
- Handling and tabling correspondence
- Dealing with administrative tasks related to meeting decisions.
- Maintaining the official records of the P&C Association, including the constitution, rules, policies and procedures, ABN details, register of members and meeting attendance

Treasurer

- Accounting for all funds and assets of the P&C Association
- Ensuring compliance with financial accountability requirements, including financial records
- Maintenance of P&C Association bank accounts
- Financial reporting at P&C meetings
- Signatory to all P&C Association bank accounts
- Taking new membership or membership renewals
- Organising the annual audit of accounts as required
- Overseeing staff wages and entitlements (should the P&C Association have employees)
- Working with the P&C Association bookkeeper (if one has been engaged)
