### Senior School Contributions Years 11 & 12 2025

Bossley Park High School values the contributions parents make to the school to support the purchase of learning resources. I would like to inform parents of the purpose and importance of our various contributions. Parental support in the prompt payment of these contributions in the past has ensured the very best of education at Bossley Park High School.

- There is the general contribution, set at \$50.00 per student. This still, remains less than half the figure suggested by the Department of Education. We call this the **Administration** contribution. It is used chiefly to supplement government funding and to make possible such purchases as library resources, school environment improvements, learning material and certificates.
- There is a **Community Support Group** (CSG) levy of \$2.00 per student. The CSG is the school's parent body (commonly referred to as the P&C) which acts in a governance role and does not undertake any fundraising. Parents and interested community members are welcome to attend CSG meetings. These funds are used to fund Parent based initiatives within the school.
- The **E-Learning** contribution of \$38.00 per student is to support the school's emphasis to have state of the art technology and to increase opportunities for student access and skill development. To assist students and staff we employ Technical Support Officers to manage, maintain and support all technology and programs throughout the school. Every room is provided an interactive screen/projector. We have over 1400 devices for student use within classrooms. Depending upon the course studied, other technology may be accessed, ie. 3D printers, laser cutters, CNC mills, A4 and A2 colour printers. A "smart card" is provided to all students with an embossed personalised photograph. This ID card enables students to access colour printing and photocopying and includes \$5.00 credit which can be topped up. The school subscribes to online programs use at home for revision and course work. The school will also provide each student with a subscription to Edrolo to access coursework, study tips, feedback tools and revision activities to most senior courses
- There is the Textbook Hire Deposit, set at \$50.00 for year 11 students. This once-only deposit is
  fully refundable when textbooks are returned in a reasonable condition at the time the student
  leaves our school. The typical senior student is issued with more than \$350.00 worth of textbooks
  or online access in each of the senior years it is expected that this deposit will encourage all
  students to care for this huge investment in their senior schooling.
- The **Sport** contribution which is \$20 for senior students is used to subsidise the cost of buses to the Athletics Carnival. Attendance is compulsory at Carnivals and non-refundable for non-attendees.
- There are Course contributions set for years 11 & 12 to cover the cost of materials used by students in those courses. If these contributions are not paid, then the student will be expected to supply the necessary materials themself to participate in those particular learning activities and to meet course requirements.
