Students then had the chance to create their own artworks using traditional painting techniques and natural themes. The class responded with enthusiasm and focus, with many participants saying it was one of the most enjoyable lessons they've had this term. They were fully engaged throughout the workshop, not only with the painting but also with the cultural knowledge shared.
































Warren Show 2025



NAJDOC Week 2025 - Celebrating 50 years of Indigenous voices, culture and resilience

Outside of the Aboriginal Education Officer's Room is a display of some past NAIDOC posters from previous years to the present day. Each year, the NAIDOC Committee has a theme that recognises particular issues that have impacted our mobs over the years. This year, NAIDOC Week will be held from July 6 to July 13, and it's a special celebration as this year marks 50 years of NAIDOC. This year's theme is: The Next Generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy.

National NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia in the first week of July each year (Sunday to Sunday) to celebrate and recognise the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

NAIDOC stands for the National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. Its origins can be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal civil rights groups in the 1920s and 1930s, particularly the Australian Aborigines Progressive Association (AAPA) in 1924 and the Australian Aborigines League (AAL) in 1932, which sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

It is one of our most important annual celebrations and provides an opportunity for all Australians to learn about our cultures and histories and participate in local activities that celebrate the milestones and achievements of the oldest continuous living cultures on Earth.
