

Then the P&C Meeting will be held at 7pm at school - all families are encouraged to attend.



BANKSIA CLASSROOM WITH MRS SCHULZ AND MISS ELLIS

We've had a fantastic start to the term here at Banksia. It was wonderful to begin Kindergarten transitions last week, welcoming our three newest students, Edison, Logan and Rorie-Mae into the school community.

We also came together last Friday to celebrate 'Day for Daniel', promoting safety and respect for all children.

A huge thank you to all the parents and students who sent in gifts for Teacher's Appreciation Day—we greatly appreciate your kindness and support. We are very grateful to have Miss Paige 5 days a week as the SLSO in Banksia.

We're looking forward to a fun and successful term ahead!

This term, our students have been enjoying reading fluency activities with the fun Aaron Blabey "Pig the Pug" books. They are exploring rhyming words, making predictions, and learning about sentence structure, punctuation, and new

vocabulary. We've also been diving into quality stories like 'The Gruffalo' and 'Three', using these books to help students understand how sentences are put together through clear, step-by-step teaching. It's been wonderful to see the students' confidence and



love for writing continue to grow!

In Drama we are finishing the year off with an end of year production. Each student has been allocated a role within the play and have designed their own costumes. Families will be asked to create the costume to bring in for the production (e.g wombat, koala, angel). This could include a mask of that particular animal and wearing the colour of that animal (grey shorts and shirt for koala). Students have also been starting our Drama lessons with some warm up games to get the students thinking outside the box, getting them out of their comfort zone and building confidence for the stage!

In Mathematics, our students have been exploring numbers and their meanings through a range of practical, hands-on activities. They have practised counting objects, matching numbers to groups, and learned how numbers can be broken into parts. In our lessons about time, students have been using number lines and discovering patterns, like counting by 5s, to help them make connections and build strong number skills. It's been a great opportunity for students to deepen their understanding of numbers and how they work in everyday life.



In History, we are looking at family roles and the differences from 'back in the day' to now and how things have changed in the household including the influences that have caused these change e.g technology, money. The students have also been learning about 'family trees', identifying how different each of our families are, completing their very own family tree.




Waratah students had a great time in Science with Ms J, creating and testing electrical circuits.
