Second Step Program

We want your child to be as successful as possible at school. Success in school is not just about reading and maths. It is also about knowing how to learn and how to get along with others. This semester, our school will be using the Second Step program each Monday afternoon in our classrooms to teach these critical skills. This evidence-based program helps children develop their social-emotional competence and self-regulation skills.

The Second Step program teaches skills in the following four areas:

- 1. **Skills for Learning:** students gain skills to help themselves learn, including how to focus their attention, listen carefully, use self-talk to stay on task and be assertive when asking for help with schoolwork.
- Empathy: students learn to identify and understand their own and other people's feelings. Students also learn how to take another perspective and how to show compassion.
- 3. **Emotion Management:** students learn specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger.
- 4. **Problem Solving:** students learn a process for solving problems with others in a positive way.

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This month, our school wide theme is our school as a welcoming place where every student feels like he or she belongs. In our school assemblies and daily interactions, we'll be reminding students to welcome others and act and speak in a way that reflects safe, respectful, proud, learner behaviours. The Second Step program includes lessons designed to support and reinforce these positive behaviours.

Support your child at home in welcoming others and acting and speaking in safe, respectful and proud ways. Engaging with External Providers

Dear Parents/Carers.

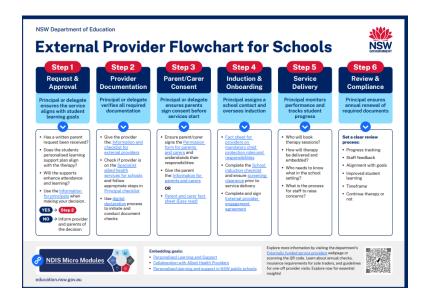
We would like to remind you about the expectations regarding external provider assessments for your children. When a teacher receives an assessment from an external provider, it is expected that this assessment is completed and returned to the relevant person within two weeks.

We encourage you to be aware of your child's assessment timeline and check in with the external provider regarding when they need this information. Planning accordingly will help ensure that all necessary documentation is submitted on time, supporting your child's health/learning journey.

Additionally, attached below is the process for parents wishing to have external providers engage with their child during school time. It is preferred that you engage with

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external providers off the school site. Where this is not possible, it is an option for parents and carers to meet with the external provider and child on the school site. It is important that you as the parent and/or carer is aware of the service being provided as well as providing needed supervision of the session.
