We will meet where we departed from in the morning. Please note that exact train arrival time will be posted on the school Facebook page when we are on a train at Lidcombe station. ### **Explanation of the activity**

The NSW Department of Education is presenting Pulse Alive 2026 to be held at Ken Rosewall Arena, Sydney Olympic Park in March 2026. This event involves thousands of students in Kindergarten to Year 12 from public schools across NSW.

### **Description of the information that will be collected**

Information collected may include your child's name, age, school and information collected by Pulse Alive such as photographs, sound and visual recordings of your child, your child's work and participation in Pulse Alive and expressions of opinion such as in interactive media. Pulse Alive may be recorded for publication purposes and to create professional learning materials for teachers. Various media outlets may also attend to collect footage of students.

Students may be filmed and photographed while preparing and performing as part of the event and at workshops. Background footage of students may also be obtained, and students may be interviewed in formal or informal settings with a teacher present.

### **Explanation of where the information will be published**

Material obtained at the event may be published in print and in online publications of state, regional and local newspapers as well as on national television networks. It may also be shared on the NSW Department of Education channels such as [www.education.nsw.gov.au](http://www.education.nsw.gov.au) and or [www.artsunit.nsw.edu.au](http://www.artsunit.nsw.edu.au) and their associated media channels.

In addition, information may be published on The Arts Unit Facebook channel and/or Department of Education, Facebook/Twitter channels. These forms of social media are explicitly used for promoting excellence in NSW public schools.

The channels are monitored by NSW Department of Education staff.
