In the K-2 classroom, students enthusiastically explored language to describe positions and spatial relationships. They used diverse terms like "next to," "between," and "above" to clearly communicate. Some children refined their descriptions for precision, enhancing their understanding of spatial dynamics. The hands-on activity of giving and following directions on a grid fostered collaboration and joy, resulting in many "aha!" moments. This experience helped young learners become confident communicators and thinkers. Great job, everyone!





Our K-2 students have been busy investigating arrays in mathematics. An array is an arrangement of objects, pictures, or numbers in columns and rows. The class can now create their own arrays, write matching number sentences (e.g., 3 rows of 4 is 3 x 4 = 12), and work out the total number in each array. How clever!

Well done, young mathematicians!


ABUR MAJOR MOTION PICTURE CROSEDUTES GREAT GREAT

PREPARING YOUR CHILD FOR 'BIG SCHOOL'

Parents can ease their children's transition to 'Big School' by creating a safe and exciting environment.

Key strategies include:

- Discussing what school will be like and establishing a daily routine.
- Encouraging independence in tasks like dressing and packing.
- · Visiting the school and meeting teachers beforehand.
- Engaging in games and reading to develop basic skills.

Literacy Tips

- · Read regularly and encourage pointing out letters.
- Engage in conversations to build vocabulary.
- · Introduce letters and sounds playfully.
- Encourage storytelling to enhance narrative skills.
- · Practice writing with fun materials.
- Play literacy games to reinforce skills.
- Create a print-rich environment at home.

Numeracy Tips:

- · Count objects during daily activities.
- Use numbers in context in conversations.
- Play games that focus on number recognition.
- Explore shapes and patterns in the environment.
- Sort and classify items to develop categorization skills.
- Introduce simple measurements during play.
- Use everyday math language to build understanding.

General Tips:

- Be patient and positive; focus on exploration and enjoyment.
- Make learning hands-on and playful.
- Celebrate efforts and progress.
- Communicate with preschool teachers to align learning activities.

At Carcoar Public School, we use Sentral as our main communication tool with families. The Sentral Parent Portal is a one-stop shop for payments, attendance, permission notes, and more.

We use Sentral to send information and updates such as school closures, permission notes, invoices, school events, and student absences. Please download the app, log in with your token number, and turn on notifications. For 2025, we have also implemented Student Pay+ through Sentral, which is our online uniform shop.


