ASSESSMENT AT CPS



Assessment is a continual process that takes place daily in the classrooms.

Assessment modes are varied but include:

unstructured - such as through general classroom observation

slightly structured - which might include quizzes and reviewing student work samples

more structured - scheduled assessments based on the work students have been learning about in class. We use Essential Assessment to track student progress at beginning, mid and end of year points.

We use Facebook to share school celebrations, successes, and promote positive stories about Carcoar Public School. Follow our Facebook page to stay up to date with us!




