Class 1



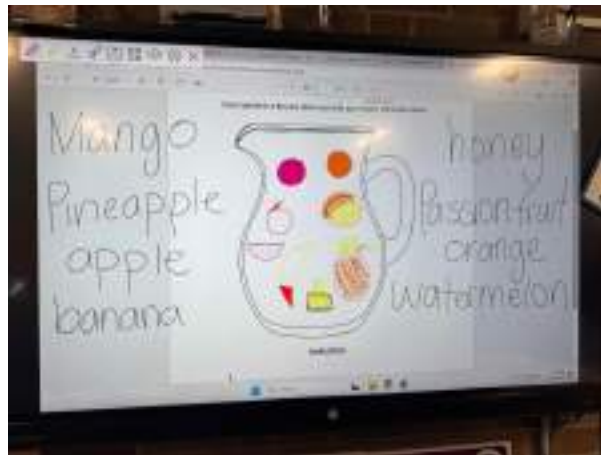

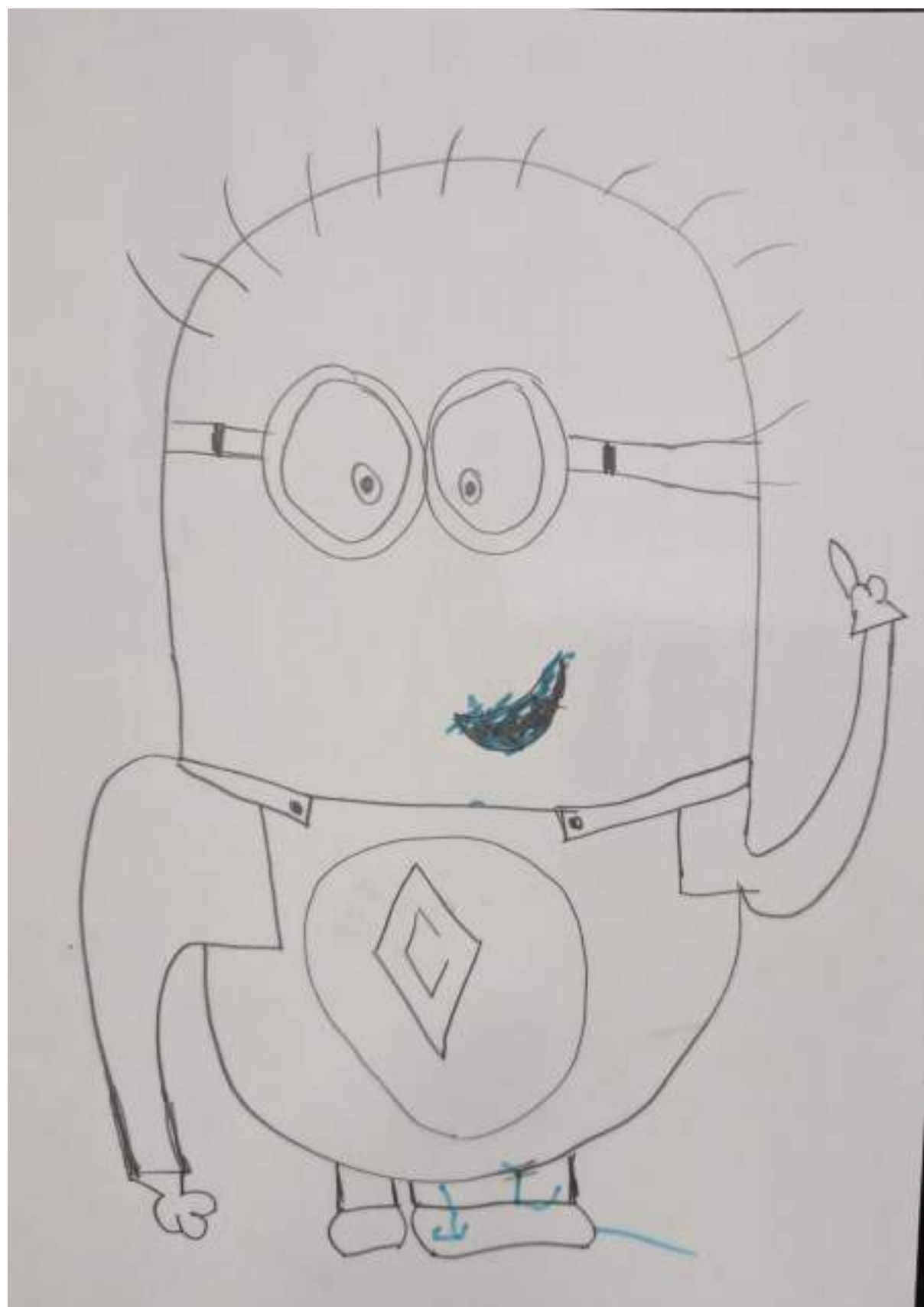

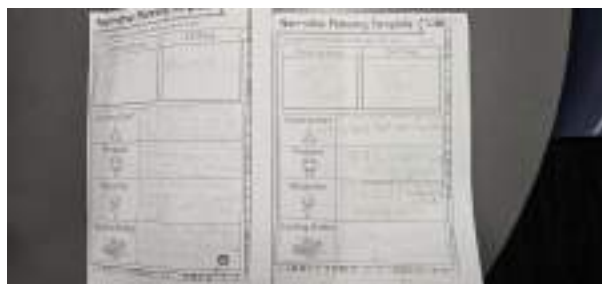
