- **Creative Arts:** Students will learn about the history of fireworks and will create a range of artworks throughout the term.


I hope everyone had a restful break and is ready for another wonderful term of learning!

Class 3

Afternoon Parents and Carers,

Science: This term in Science, we are investigating the different types of changes that materials can undergo, specifically distinguishing between physical and chemical changes, and whether these changes are reversible or irreversible. This week, students explored the

foundations of this concept through a range of engaging, hands-on activities. Using their senses of sight, touch, and smell, they observed and discussed changes involving frozen milk, effervescent tablets, bicarbonate of soda and vinegar, ice, salt and water, and burnt chocolate. Students demonstrated a high level of engagement and were eager to share their observations and opinions about the nature of these changes. It was a highly successful introduction to the unit.

Mathematics: This term, the class will be developing their understanding of 2D and 3D shapes, multiplication and division, as well as fractions. Students will engage in a balanced program that includes hands-on activities, computer-based tasks, and bookwork, providing them with varied and meaningful opportunities to consolidate their learning.

In Creative Arts, the class has been busily creating beautiful Mother's Day plates to take home. Students carefully chose colours they know their mothers or they themselves like, and many added lovely, personal touches with painted designs and pictures. They have taken great pride in their work, and it has been wonderful to see their creativity and thoughtfulness shine through.

History: This term, our class is exploring the fascinating time of Medieval Europe. It has been wonderful to see the students immersing themselves in the era, experimenting with medieval-style language and engaging creatively with poetry from that time.

Geography: We will investigate the weather and climate of places. This week we learnt about tropical, desert and polar climates and characteristics of each.





Class 7 created cubism and roll-a-landscape art.


Class 7 looked into self-management.

Science: This term is science, students will be learning about the human body and how it functions, with particular emphasis on performance and fuelling the body. 

Society and Culture: This term in Society and Culture class 8 are studying Rights & Freedoms; The Australian and American civil rights movements. We have begun by learning what exactly our civil rights are as well as the difference between them and human rights. After studying the Jim Crow Laws that kept American society segregated until the mid 1960s, students provided a number of inciteful discussion points regarding systemic racism in the United States and how these conditions have impacted the lives of African Americans.
