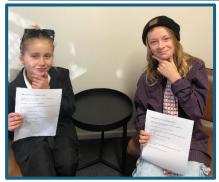

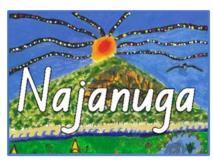

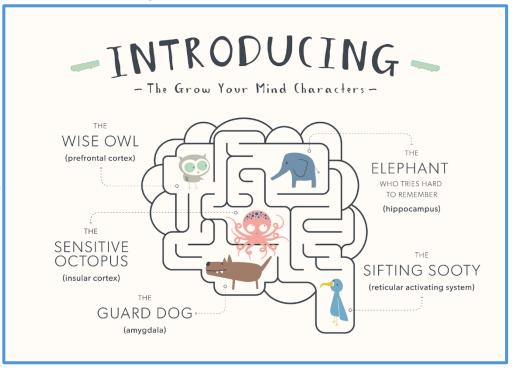




Grow Your Mind program

Our morning fitness has included a variety of skills revisited through relays. We have enjoyed incorporating hula hoop skills into the relays too. We finish with a "plank off" and a back stretch.
