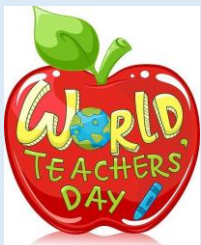

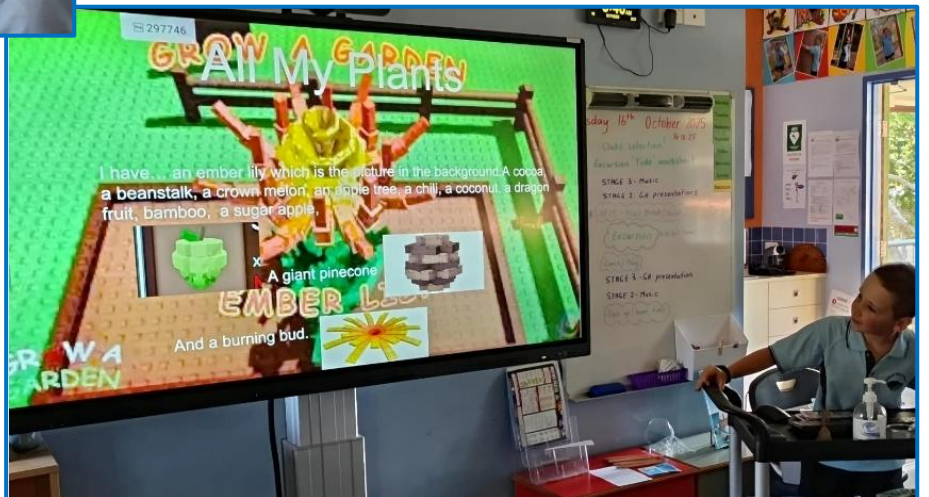
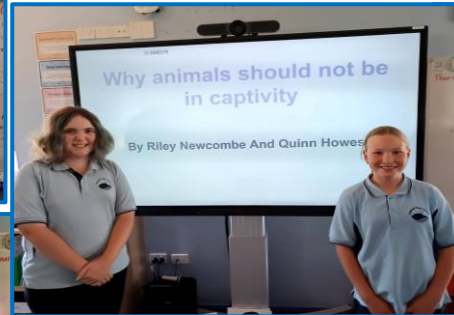
Check-in Assessment Standouts

Bowie, Otto, Lilah, Evie-Jay, Banjo and Duke achieved the grade highest scores in Numeracy.

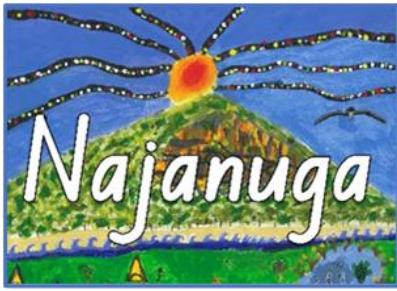
Will achieved the most growth in Numeracy and Coby in Reading.

Genius Hour

Each week students in Barranguba have Genius Hour with Mrs Manning and Miss Thomas. This is an opportunity for the students to be in charge of their learning and explore a topic or passion of their choosing. They spent an hour a week last term to further explore their chosen area or design their project. This week all students presented a term worth of research, inquiry and exploration in the form of a portfolio, slideshow or demonstration! We were blown away with the commitment Barranguba students displayed for their learning.



Home Reading came up in discussions with families during parent teacher interviews. Home reading is a great way to support your child's literacy development and has many benefits including family bonding and promoting a love of reading. Reading with your child for just 5 to 10 minutes each day can have a huge impact on reading growth by improving fluency, increasing vocabulary knowledge and building confidence.

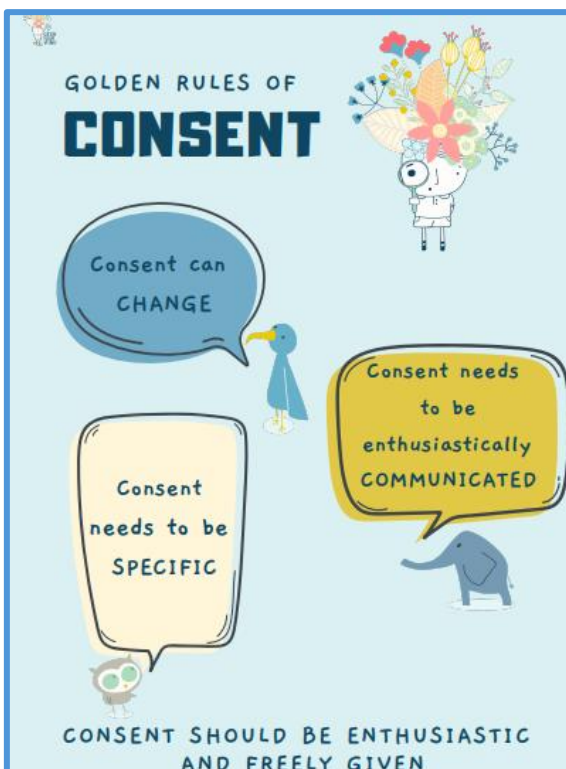
Things to keep in mind when reading together

Support your child to:

- decode the whole word using letter sounds (try not to guess the word)
- blend the sounds in the word together (for example h-o-p hop, sh-e-ll shell, ch-i-ck-e-n chicken)
- repeat the word
- reread the sentence to maintain the meaning of the text
- explain the meaning of the word – some words have more than one meaning
- praise your child for trying, mistakes are part of learning.



In our **Grow Your Mind** unit the K12 students are learning about consent as part of the PDHPE curriculum. So far, the students have learnt what consent means (seeking and giving permission) and the 3 Golden Rules of Consent. They have also been listening to and learning *The Consent Song* which encapsulates the themes and messages of this unit.
