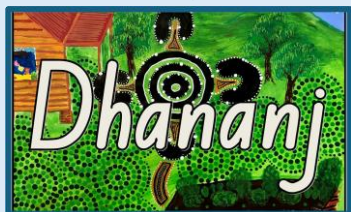

Meanwhile, parents enjoyed morning tea in the office while Brooke and Jess explained, School Bytes, uniforms, P&C and answered any questions.



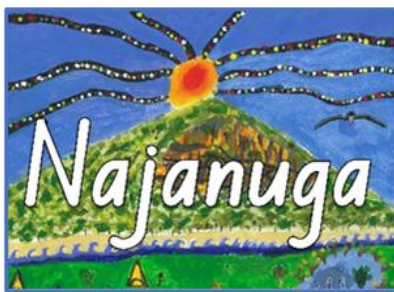
Kitchen Garden

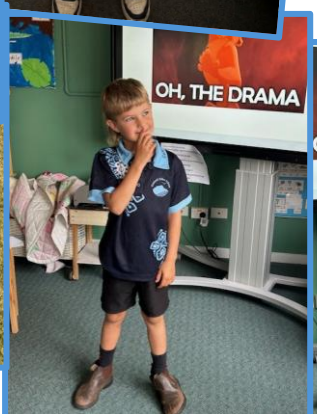

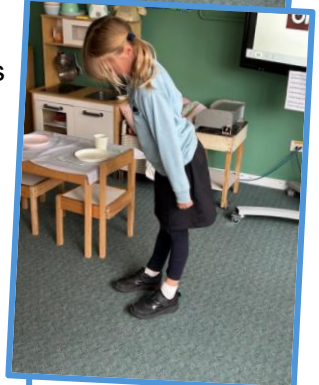
Mass

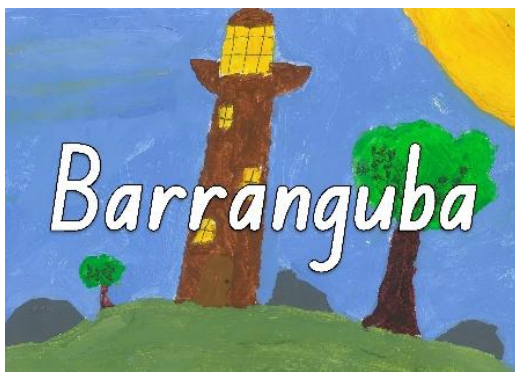


Friday's challenge, make a bridge from natural materials that can hold a weight.

Shhhhh! Year 6 have been busy working on their end-of-year presentation to the school. We can't wait for the big reveal on presentation day!



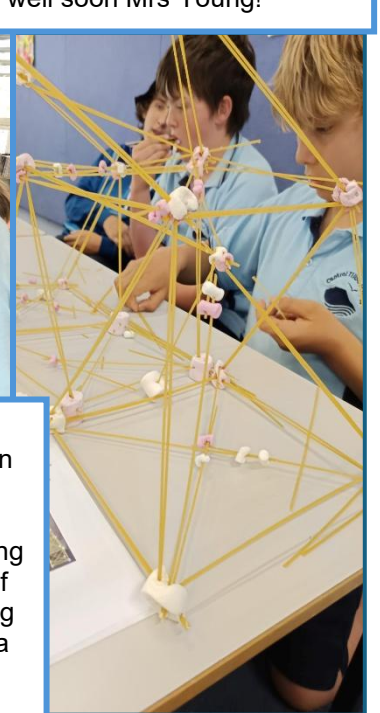
Heidi and Otto face-off in the 6 x Multiplication Challenge this week.

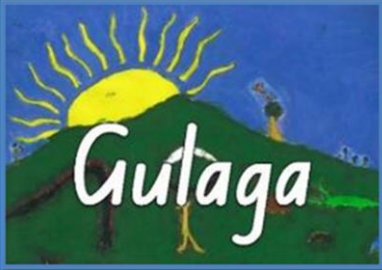


Mrs Roll was solo this week as Mrs Young was sick. Coby and Leon both finished their stuffed toys. Get well soon Mrs Young!
