Selective high school and opportunity class applications opening – sample text for applications notice

About this resource:

This resource is a sample notice to inform parents/carers that selective high school and opportunity class applications are open and how to apply.

How to use this resource:

- Copy and paste this sample text into your school newsletter or online parent/carer notification platform (for example, Skoolbag, Enews or Sentral) to inform parents/carers that selective high school and opportunity class applications are open.
- You may like to add the contact details of a staff member from your school who can answer any parent/carer questions about selective high schools and opportunity classes or assist parents/carers to apply.

Selective high school and opportunity class applications are open from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025

Selective high school Year 7 entry in 2026: Apply when your child is at the end of Year 5 or the beginning of Year 6.

Opportunity class Year 5 entry in 2026: Apply when your child is at the end of Year 3 or the beginning of Year 4.

<u>Selective high schools and opportunity classes</u> are 2 of the ways the NSW Department of Education supports high potential and gifted students.

What are their benefits?

- Students learn alongside, and form friendships with, other high potential and gifted classmates.
- Special teaching methods allow students to learn at a quicker pace and in more detail.
- Research shows that students benefit both academically and socially when learning with classmates who have similar abilities.

Selective high schools and opportunity classes are not zoned so you can apply to ones outside your local enrolment area.

Is a selective high school or opportunity class the right fit for my child?

A selective high school or opportunity class might be a great fit if your child:

- learns quickly
- asks complex questions
- is highly motivated
- has a good memory
- · is intensely focused in their area of interest

Where are selective high schools (Year 7-12) located?

There are 4 types of selective high schools:

- fully selective high schools, where all students attending the school have high potential or are gifted
- partially selective high schools, where there is a mix of students who have high potential or are gifted and local area students
- 4 agricultural selective high schools, including 3 boarding schools
- Aurora College, which provides online selective classes for rural and remote students in their local host schools.

Search for a selective high school near you at Find a selective high school.

Where are opportunity classes (Year 5-6) located?

There are 2 types of opportunity classes:

- full-time opportunity classes in selected primary schools
- Aurora College, which provides online opportunity classes for rural and remote students in their local <u>authorised host schools</u>.

Search for an opportunity class near you at Find an opportunity class.

Students successfully placed attend the opportunity class full-time in Years 5 and 6. In most cases, students who have accepted a place in an opportunity class will leave their current school to attend the school with the opportunity class.

Discuss the opportunity with your child and look through the information together on the <u>Selective</u> high schools and opportunity classes website and in the student resource hub:

Fair and equitable access

The <u>Equity Placement Model</u> helps make access fairer for more high potential students in our community.

We know that some students may be missing out because they experience educational disadvantage.

Under the model, up to 20% of places in each selective high school and opportunity class are held for:

- students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- students from rural and remote locations

These students still receive offers based on their performance in the placement test.

NAPLAN 2025 parent and carer information

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.

Reading and spelling tricky words.

Writing / Spelling:

- Correct letter formation.
- Writing words and sentences.

Comprehension:

- Listening and reading comprehension.

Grammar



Year 2

Whole-class explicit instruction

- 4 lessons / week

Spelling:

- Phonic decoding/encoding.
- Word morphology (Base words, prefix, and suffix knowledge.
- Rules and conventions.
- Spelling of tricky words.
- Sentence dictation.

Comprehension and Fluency

 Developing comprehension and reading fluency strategies.

Grammar in Writing

- Common and proper nouns.
- Prepositions and conjunctions.
- Verbs, verb tense and adverbs.



Years 3 and 4

Whole-class explicit instruction

- 3 lessons / week

Word Phonology:

- Studying speech sounds in language.
- Using knowledge of sounds in words and letter- sound correspondences to spell words correctly.

Word Orthography / Etymology:

- Studying word origins and meanings.
- Learning to use knowledge of word origins to understand why words are spelled in a certain way.

Word Morphology:

 Learning the conventions of writing, using rules and conventions to spell words correctly.

Every newsletter I'll be sharing some ideas/tips/advice with you on topics I often get questions about. I hope you find it relevant and useful.

Transition to/back to school

A new school year can be exciting but may also bring some nervousness. It's natural for children to experience a mix of emotions and adjustment as they begin the year with many changes – a new grade, teacher, classroom, mix of peers...the list goes on. Here are key ways to support your child's transition:

- ◆ Stay Positive Encourage excitement about new experiences and reassure them that feeling nervous is normal.
- ◆ Set Routines Early Gradually adjust sleep and morning schedules to ease into the school rhythm.
- Encourage Friendships Arrange playdates or talk about ways to make new friends.
- ◆ Validate Feelings Listen to their worries and remind them that adjusting takes time.
- ◆ Build Independence Give small responsibilities to boost confidence in handling school tasks.
- Stay Supportive Check in regularly and seek additional help if needed.

With patience, structure, and encouragement, your child will soon feel comfortable and confident in their new routine!
