A message from our Principal

It's wonderful to see some warmer weather as we move into the final weeks of Term 3. With the change in season, we hope everyone is feeling a bit more energised and ready to finish the term on a positive note.

This term has been particularly challenging for our school community as we have been hit hard by illness. Many students and staff have been affected by influenza, RSV, and COVID. We appreciate everyone's efforts to stay home when unwell and to follow health guidelines to keep our community safe.

At the same time, I want to emphasise the importance of regular attendance. Consistent attendance is crucial not only for maintaining academic progress but also for helping our school community to better manage and recover from times of widespread illness. When students attend regularly, it supports their learning continuity and helps minimise disruption to their education.

Despite these challenges, the school continues to prioritise student wellbeing through a range of valuable programs. Over the past few weeks, we have run Fit for Life, RFDS Art Therapy, Love Bites, and marked RUOK Day. These initiatives are an important part of supporting our students' mental and emotional health and fostering a positive school culture.

However, I must address a serious concern. Unfortunately, we are still seeing too much bullying behaviour occurring across the school. Comments such as telling someone to "go kill themselves" or calling others "fat" or "anorexic" are completely unacceptable. These behaviours cause real harm and do not reflect the values of respect and kindness we strive to uphold. I ask all members of our community to stand together against bullying and to support each other in creating a safe and inclusive environment for everyone.

For our Year 12 students, these are the final two weeks of Term 3 and indeed your secondary schooling. I encourage you to make the most of your remaining time at school, study hard, and prepare well for your upcoming HSC exams. Your dedication and focus now will set you up for success in the weeks ahead.

Thank you for your ongoing support. Let's work together to finish the term strong and continue building a school community where every student feels valued and respected.

celebrate the day!












love Bites Dorkshop




Crafting Success in 4TECH9!





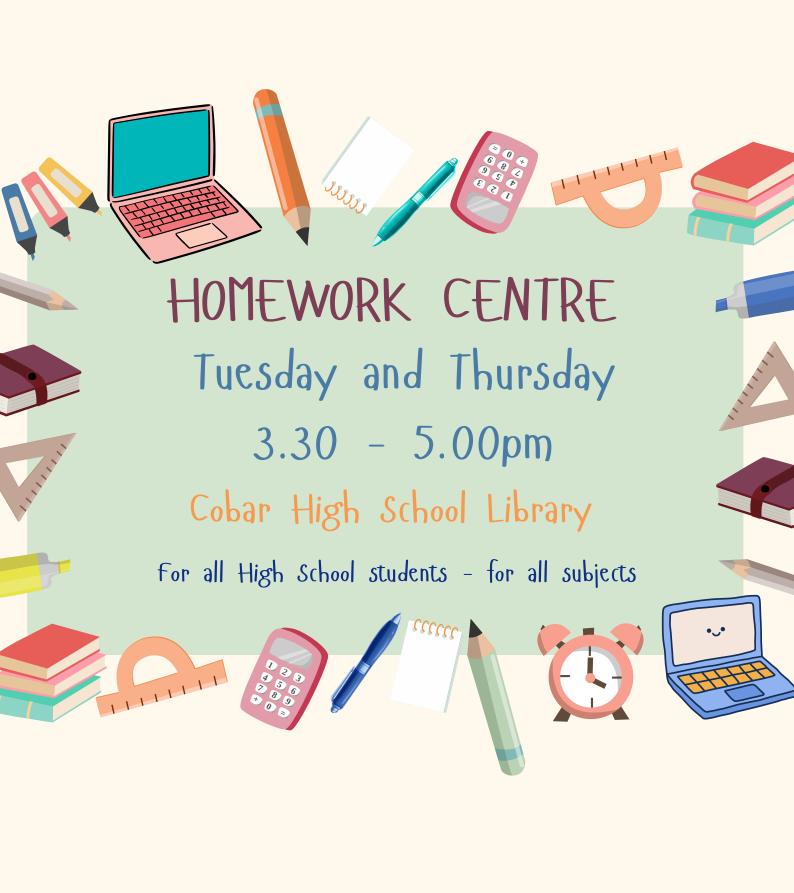
