


Rollercoaster Physics!

SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2025

DEAR PARENTS & GUARDIANS,

We are pleased to inform you that the Sacrament of First Holy Communion for 2025 will be celebrated at St Lawrence O'Toole Church on Sunday, 22nd June at 9am (the feast of the Body & Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi).

This is a very special and sacred moment in your child's faith journey. The Sacrament of First Holy Communion is one of the most significant steps in the Catholic faith, where children receive the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time. It is a beautiful opportunity for them to deepen their relationship with Jesus and our Catholic community.

To help you understand the process and significance of this special occasion, there will be a Parent Information Session on Thursday, 22nd May at 5:00pm at St Lawrence O'Toole Church. We strongly encourage all parents of participating students to attend. In preparation for receiving the Sacrament, your child will complete four lessons:

Lesson 1 (at home): Given to students on Friday, 23rd May and due back the following Friday, 30th May.

Lesson 3 (at home): Provided on Friday, 6th June, to be completed by the following Friday, 13th June.

Lesson 4 (at school): Conducted by Fr. Paul and Mr. Bennett, held on Thursday, 12th June at 12:00pm.

In addition, there will be a practice session for all participating students on Friday, 20th June at 2pm, to help them feel confident and prepared for the big day.
