Well done to all students involved - you represented Cobar High School with pride!






Cobar High School Attendance Snapshot

At 90% there are just a few absences across the term. With all absences being explained.


90% SNAPSHOT



69% SNAPSHOT


At 69% you can see a range of whole day absences and also partial absence unexplained.










NSW Public Schools Student Survey Please read the following

Our talented students practicing "Taking Care" by Andrew Howes to be performed live with the Sydney Youth Orchestra.




