Stage 2 Excursion- Bound for Botany Bay



On Monday, our Stage 2 students embarked on an engaging and educational excursion to Bare Island, participating in the 'Bound for Botany Bay' historical program. This immersive experience provided a vivid insight into Australia's colonial past, aligning with their studies on First Contacts.

Students delved into the lifestyles of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, gaining a deeper understanding of their rich cultures and histories. They explored the fortifications of Bare Island, standing where early European explorers once did, and learned about the strategic importance of the site. The program highlighted the severe punishments convicts faced, such as transportation for crimes like theft and forgery, offering students a tangible connection to the past. Students were amazed at the 18 tonne cannon still intact on the island which provided a tangible link to the past.

Overall, the day was both fun-filled and educationally adventurous, offering students a deeper understanding of Australia's heritage.
